The total number of Ultrasound machines funded by the Knights of Columbus has now passed 700 and counting. The Supreme Council has now begun funding up to 100% of the cost of ultrasounds when they are placed as a mobile unit in a van operated by a crisis pregnancy center (such as a stork bus). Countless babies are being saved because of Ultrasounds, which now are able to detect the baby's heartbeat as early as six weeks.
