LENTEN FRIDAY FISH FRY REPORT- Anthony Gennusa

Brother Knights,

The average cost for each fish fry is approx. \$860.00 per week.

On average, we serve 378 meals per fish fry. Our largest week was week four – we served 473 meals. My focus this year was on process and cost containment. I think we did good controlling our spending. I contribute this to using our dedicated vendors and having better control on our products.

We want everyone to have a great food experience. To ensure this we made a slight adjustment with our coleslaw. We decided to not keep coleslaw left over for re-distribution the following week. This is a very minor change and the cost is pennies compared to having a bad taste experience.
