David Still's Retirement from the

Armed Services

On May 7, 2017 David B. Still retired after 20 years serving our country in the armed forces. David is a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 15126 at St. Francis Xavier Church in St. Joseph, MO. In August of 1993, at 18 years of age David enlisted in the US Army. After completing his basic training at Fort Benning, GA his first assignment in the infantry was mission sent David to New Orleans Oahu, Hawaii. During his 3 years in Hawaii he was sent to Thailand on joint US and Thai military exercises. His next assignment took him to Fort Campbell, KY where he served for the next 5 years in a mortar platoon. During his time at Fort Campbell his unit was sent on various missions. David and his unit went to Egypt for 6 months on unit. In 2013 David was again dea peace keeping mission as a multinational force of observers to make sure Egypt and Israel kept their sides of the Camp David Accord. After 8 years in the regular army David returned home and began working at the Missouri

American Water Company. He missed the spirit of service and dedication to our country and reenlisted in the Missouri Army National Guard in late in 2004 as a crew chief for the AH-64 Apache Attack Helicopter. David's assigned post for weekends and summer camp was at Whiteman Air Force Base in Knob Noster, MO. The first for security patrols and clean up after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. His first combat deployment was from 2006 to 2007 to Camp Arifjan in Kuwait. From there he was sent forward to Bagram Air Force Base in Afghanistan. There he conducted depot level maintenance for an Arizona National Guard Apache ployed to Afghanistan, this time to Shindad Air Force Base. While there he supervised and conducted maintenance on 4 Apache Attack Helicopters. After 13 years in the National Guard, David retired as a section leader, supervis-

ing a maintenance section, overseeing inspections and working on the Apache helicopters. David received his medal and certificates of service at a ceremony at Whiteman Air Force Base. His wife, Alex, was also recognized for her sacrifices and service as a military wife. All 6 of David's children were able to watch the ceremony, four were physically present at the base and David's two older sons viewed via skype. Logan, his oldest son, was serving in the Marines in North Carolina and his second son, Raine, viewed the ceremony on skype while serving at the Air Force Base in Lakenheath, England. David's parents, Frank and Phyllis Still were also at the ceremony. Frank is also a Knight of Council 15126.

Welchert Named USFWS Midwest Region NWRs Biologist of the Year

On May 16, 2017, Darrin M. Welchert was awarded the Midwest National Wildlife Refuge System (NWRS) Biologist of the Year for Fiscal Year 2016. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Midwest Region (3) is comprised of over 55 NWRs and 8 states. This annual award recognizes professional excellence and outstanding achievements of an individual within the Region 3 National Wildlife Refuge System's Natural Resources and Conservation Planning Program during the previous fiscal year. The winner of the title this year demonstrated an impressive array of accomplishments in leadership, innovation, mentoring, and impact on conservation.

Darrin Welchert joined Loess
Bluffs National Wildlife Refuge as
the Wildlife Biologist in November 2010. He holds a B.S. degree
in Natural Resources with a
major in Fisheries and Wildlife
from the University of Nebraska
- Lincoln and a M.S. degree in
Wildlife and Fisheries Resources
from West Virginia University.

He started his career as a volunteer intern and seasonal biological technician at the Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge in southwestern Wyoming in 1998. Darrin spent almost 10 years at the Aransas National Wildlife Refuge on the Texas Gulf Coast as a forestry technician, biological technician, and wildlife biologist from 2001 to 2010. At Loess Bluffs National Wildlife Refuge, Darrin is responsible for coordination and implementation of the refuge's biological program which includes habitat management planning, research and monitoring. In 2016, Darrin lead a biological program rooted in science and supported by collaboration with many federal, state, non-profit, and university partnerships. Darrin addressed challenges with wet prairie and massasauga rattlesnake management head-on while preparing a habitat management plan by engaging stakeholders and promoting sound science. His efforts addressed Loess Bluff NWR's habitat and wildlife man-

agement priorities across multiple objectives and linked refuge management actions to biology. Partners included US Geological Survey, National Wildlife Health Center, National Great Rivers Research and Education Center, Americorps, The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, and Missouri Western State University. Darrin is a highly respected biologist and is sought for his expertise on prairie massasauga, wetland management, and prairie restoration. As a key member of the Loess Bluffs work team, Darrin provided mentorship to many volunteers, students, interns, and biological technicians. His influence extended beyond the refuge through University committees, graduate advisor roles, and involvement with The Wildlife Society. Darrin is always a team player and works tirelessly to provide high quality scientific research and analysis while exemplifying fantastic leadership, mentoring, and a positive impact on conservation.
