

Brother Vince Burkemper and his wife Marianne successfully completed the MR340 the week of August 8-11, 2017. The MR340 is a race across the entire state of Missouri..... just you and your boat thrown against 340

miles of wind, heat, bugs, and rain. As the website states; "this ain't no moma's boy float trip!" The race promises to test your mettle from the first stroke in KC to the last gasp in St. Charles.

The Missouri 340 is an endurance race across the state of Missouri. Competitors will start in Kansas City and finish, some of them anyway, in St. Charles. With numerous towns and hamlets, the course offers plenty of opportunity for resupply while enroute. The Missouri River is also incredibly scenic and isolated in some stretches, with wildlife and beautiful vistas to rival any river in North America. But if you're trying to win this race, you won't have time to enjoy any of it.



Participants are allowed exactly 88 hours to complete the course. There are nine checkpoints along the route where paddlers are required to sign in and sign out. Cutoff times will be associated with these checkpoints based on the 88 hour pace. Failure to checkpoint deadlines is grounds for disqualification. To finish this race in 88 hours is a huge accomplishment. Only 2/3 of the teams were able to do that last year.

Vince and Marianne finished the grueling event in a mere 62 hours and 25 minutes. They were 6th out of 22 boats in the mixed tandem division and 102 out of 372 total boats.



Vince said "We passed three barges. Two of the barges were pretty big and one we passed in the night time. The weather was great low 80s during the day and 61 at night. The first day we paddled 142 miles with only one 15 minute stop for water resupply. We stopped for 3 hours and 50 minutes in Glasgow Missouri for some sleep, then we paddled 88 miles without stopping.".



Vince had an issue with his stomach after only eating 16 ounces of tuna on the second day. Vince said "So I called my good cousin who lives in Jefferson City. He met us at the boat ramp at 8:53 pm. He took us back to his house where I took a hot shower. I had some chicken soup and lean turkey and drank 58 oz of water. I sleep for 8 hours."



On Thursday with only 115 miles to the finish line they got in the boat at 7:11 am and powered down to St. Charles.

Vince stated, "We only made one 20 minute stop in Herman were my son Drew met us at the ramp with supplies. We finished on Thursday at 10:25 pm."

Challenger Baseball is a baseball league for kids and adults with developmental disabilities from ages 5 on up. Since 1994 the main goal of St. Louis Challenger Baseball has been to make friends!

The fundamental goal of Challenger Baseball is to make friends. As the players who have disabilities play baseball they have the opportunity to make friends with teammates, who have disabilities, and buddies, who do not have disabilities. Buddies are kids and young adults (between the ages of 10 and 20 who don't have disabilities) who hang out with our players on the field and assist them if they need a bit of help.

How it Works: Beyond following basic safety rules, Challenger tailors certain rules to the skill levels of the players. Challenger players play on the same fields, use the same equipment, and wear the same full uniforms as traditional teams. Teams are supported by coaches and by the buddy system. As the buddies make friends they also help by pushing players using wheelchairs around the base paths after a hit or by helping a player retrieve a ball that's gets past them, among other things. But the most important thing a buddy does is to be a friend to our players.
