Pro-life Monument

The new cross and pro-life monument that has appeared at St. Joseph is not new. This was a gift from our council given to Kennedy High School approximately 15 years ago. It originally was located next to the old highway 141 road in front of the school, but was moved to the rear of the school when the new highway was built. This magnificent cross was originally hand built by our brother knight Dave Gockley, and is about 8 ft. tall weighing about 100 pounds. When the school was being sold, brother Bob Cartwright alerted our officers about the monument and cross and suggested that we see about getting it removed from Kennedy and find a new home for it. Brother Jim Schuessler took on the project and talked to Kennedy's president and received permission to remove the monument and cross from the school grounds. Fr. Tom Santen thought that moving it to our parish grounds would be a suitable home for it and a worthy project for the knights to take on. So, the moving process started. A monument company was hired to move the several hundred-pound monument and reinstall it at St. Joe. The cross was in bad shape, with peeling yellow paint and it was severely laden with an insect infestation. Since it was determined to be salvageable, brother Dave worked on it for a month cleaning it up, filling insect holes and tunnels and painting it. A large mounting bracket with an extension pipe at the bottom was fabricated to mount the cross in the ground. The monument was installed at the south end of the parking lot and the cross was going to be placed right behind it. That is when the problems started on that cold morning of October 28th.



After digging down about one foot, a large rock was encountered and the hardy crew of Dave, Jim and Mark

Lauber (the young guy) were not able to break it up. Fr. Tim Noelker even stopped by to help, unsuccessfully!



Since dynamite wasn't an option, it was decided to move the hole another foot to the rear. This time they were able to dig the hole two feet down before hitting another rock. After about an hour of banging and digging away at it, they were able to pull the rock out by hand, almost having to stand on their heads.



But persistence won out in the end, and the 3-foot hole was finished. It took the three of them to lift the cross up and set it in the hole and to secure it in place with ropes. Concreted in place, it should last for a long time. If you haven't stopped to look at it closely, you should do so. The gold decoration on the circle of the cross was an added embellishment done by Dave's daughter, Lauren Gockley. We hope the monument and cross will be a reminder to all who pass by, that the scourge of abortion is still with us, and that we should continue to pray daily for an end to legalized abortion in our country.




Tootsie Roll Drive - Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities-
