FIELD AGENT REPORT

Only Having Insurance “Through Work” Doesn’t Work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It’s very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. First, the current cash position of the Home Association is strong, BUT I must stress that this is on the strength of transferring \$4,000 from the Fidelity Account to the Sun National Bank Operating Account. We held \$ 552 in Fidelity as a small reserve.

Second, the new Property & Liability Insurance Policy is in force and the down payment has successfully been drafted from our account to the tune of \$1,800. The current monthly premium is \$ 526 and will also be drafted on the 8th of every month for the next 9 months. Cash Flow becomes vital to making sure the Association continues to survive!

Third, we have experienced a sudden inflow of bookings for the months of March and April. Three out of four Saturday evenings are booked for April, with a O.L.P.H. Sound System Fundraiser tentatively scheduled for the 4th Saturday. The bad news is we are a little thin for the months of May, June & July!
