

## The Assumption of Mary

Mary obviously holds a special place in the Catholic Church, and a special place in heaven, but how much thought do we put into why? Many Christians look at Mary and know that she participated in the birth of the Messiah, but how many have stopped to wonder how that happened? It is only when we look at the why and how of Mary that we discover a very special truth.

We all know the problem, man sinned in the garden. The garden was made for mankind and was the place that God could be with His creation; in order to share His never ending love. Sin separated God from man, and God would not have His beloved, even after it's sin, separated from Him. He would send His Son to fix what was broken.

How could this happen? God could not be with sin. God could not answer for this sin, the covenant He made with mankind did not allow for that. Man on the other hand seemed incapable of being sinless, and if one man did, the odds of him offering that perfect life for all of mankind, that is performing the perfect act of altruism, did not seem likely. God was willing to send His Son to answer for these sins, but God the Son would have to be man to offer himself for the sin of man, but how? God would have to humble Himself to be born of a woman. But how? God could not come into contact with sin. The answer, (the how) God would make a woman without sin, so that God could inhabit her for the 9 month pregnancy. Mary would be the tabernacle, (Theotokos) the Arc that would carry God.

And so God became man, and dwelt among us, fully God and fully man in a hypostatic union. Thus the how. But we are, in the month of August, much more concerned with the why. Why would Mary then, after she gave birth and raised Jesus, be assumed? "Assumed" defined as taken bodily into heaven at the moment of death. The easiest answer is to take the analogy of the church. Let us imagine the unthinkable, St Stephen Catholic is no longer, all that is left is an empty building. The building is sold as a stable for farm animals, the tabernacle is made into a chicken coop, the altar is made into a feeder for the animals. Did you gasp? I did just writing it! But why? The reason is obvious, St Stephen's is a holy place, set apart for worship, and sacraments. God Himself resides in the tabernacle and the sacrifice of the mass is celebrated on the altar. These things are of God, we can't just turn it into a barn yard!

Mary carried God. Mary is the mother of God. She shared in the salvation of all creation. She is the queen of Heaven, and she cannot see corruption. Just as the arc of the covenant cannot be found (assumed, as it carried God), so Mary, was assumed to heaven, never seeing the corruption of death.

We celebrate this occasion, because Mary said yes. She lived life for God only, never turning to sin. As with any saint we look at Mary's life and try to imitate it. We celebrate her willingness to say yes, and praise her for the salvation that came through that "yes". The magnificent truth here is that God does wonders through mankind. This is not a father quick to spurn, or grab a tool out of His children hands saying "let me do that"! This is a loving Father who, even though we do wrong, still seeks to fix our shortcomings; and He does this through us! As we celebrate the assumption we should wonder how God will use us.

Derek and Dave need help so please volunteer or come around 4PM on August 10th. There will be Margaritas but other drink can be brought. The Knights meeting room will be used for this event. If others want to bring other meats and a grill to cook other items they are welcome. Ray asked to focus on the fish though. Stan posed that we might consider deserts for the families that are in attendance. Matt will send out a reminder for this event.

  - > Gene asked that we offer a prayer of thanks for the soccer team rescued from the cave, and that their names be put on our prayer list.
  - Ray reminded that we have our football frenzy tickets. This is a fundraiser for the state KoC, they are raffle tickets to pass out to all you see and then return the money to the council. The tickets are \$10.00 a piece.
  - Ray mentioned the golf tourney that is coming up. Ray is the chairman for this event but he could use a co-chair as well. John Achtyl said we had a gold sponsor already signed. We have flyers and forms ready of the website. Ray went over all the forms and flyers available. We need people to go to businesses in this area, possibly groups to do this, and those who have knowledge of who will participate and who might not. Lawrence asked a breakdown of holes for those who gave. Dave asked if all of us would sponsor a hole, if everyone did we would make a good profit for charity.

#### New Business:

- Ray brought up the Hike for Life. Chuck (chair of this event) said that the police will not allow us to have this on Hwy 51, This gives us two options. 1) Have a full blown parade, but shutting down main is \$2500.00. 2) The second option would be to rent the grounds at First Monday amphitheater and hold a rally. Have 4hrs of programing, music etc. We have two crisis centers in the area and both are in process or are vetted by the diocese. The dates we are looking for are the 11 May or 18 May, 2019. It was suggested to hold the event on the First Monday grounds for better visibility. This will be considered. Hike for life organization is a KoC organization. At St. Stephens it was (in the past) done with big help from the youth. If we do this the Knights will have to be lead. Dave suggested having Spring Creek etc. to come and cook food. Also bands and Christian radio stations may be included. We could do interviews with area priests as well. Weatherford Christian school might be approached for a band. Lawrence added that we have to be an approved food vender to serve food. Dave suggested Mike Fernandez or a food truck could be hired. Ray reminded us this is almost a year away but we need to be thinking about it. Chuck asked if we were in favor of this event and all said yes. Texas hike for life has a non profit set up which our moneys will be given to and that money is then donated to local charities. If we do something of our own then we would funnel monies through our own accounts but then there would be no insurance to cover us. Scott mentioned that St Stephen parish insurance might cover the event. Ray asked members for ideas and leads.
