

St. Michael the Archangel





 - ➤ Golf tournament report. Letters to all the councils went out, please consider sponsoring the tourney. Primary focus is getting sponsors, auction items etc. Explanation of the website access was given by Ray. The tourney is 2 months away, last year we had brought in 13k, now we are just under 9k. Dave had some auction items to turn in. If you collect merchandise, make certain to keep the form with it. We keep it in the clubhouse and it all needs identification.
