


#### Four Lenten Dinners Served At Parish Center



## Community "First Responder Blue Mass' Set For Sunday, April 8th at 11:30 AM

The first Blue Mass in St Joseph will be <u>Sunday April 8<sup>th</sup> at the 11:30</u> <u>am SFX Parish Mass</u>. The Mass gets it's name from the typical color of the dress uniform worn by our First Responders. Invitations have gone out to First Responders from the St Joseph Police Department, St Joseph Fire Department, St Joseph 911 Dispatch, Missouri Troop H Highway Patrol, Buchanan and Andrew Co. Sheriff Departments, Buchanan County EMT and Hazardous Material Teams, and the Savannah Police Department. This Mass will be held in conjunction with one of our Council Corporate Communion Masses and member Knights will perform all the Mass support roles (Servers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Hospitality Ministers as well as provide support from the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Assembly 569 Knights of Columbus Honor Guard). This Mass is sponsored by the Council and the Parish.

Ray Heitman is the Event Chair and has contacted all invited First Responder departments to coordinate representative participation, department vehicles, flags and uniform expectations. Mass opening procession will include the National, State and Parish flags, and a flag from each department represented. The body of the Mass will feature the full adult choir, a homily tailored to the honorees, a special blessing of the 1<sup>st</sup> Responders before exiting. The 4th Degree Honor Guard will escort participants into and out of the Mass and to the reception. Keynote Speaker for the reception in the Parish Center following the Mass will be Bill McMurray. This event will follow the election for city mayor this year and Bill is currently favored to be the newly elected mayor by that date. A static display of First Responder emergency equipment and vehicles will be staged outside of the church.

Ray Heitman has the volunteer event roster nearly complete (see web calendar for Apr. 8<sup>th</sup>). The Fourth Degree Honor Guard is coming to participate. Mike Violett will oversee the parking of the static display of emergency vehicles on the SFX premises. John Morin will coordinate the Hospitality Ministers and oversee on-site registration of First Responders attending this service before the Mass in Gaspar Hall on forms provided by Len Archer. Michelle Carmichael and Renee Rohrer will enter hand written names on Recognition Certificates provided by the Council with the personal names of the registrants. Larry Bahr has planned and will coordinate the post-Mass reception in the SFX Parish Center (Drinks, Cookies, Brownies and Punch) and Ray Heitman will serve as Master of Ceremonies for the Certificate Award Ceremony at the reception. John Catron is coordinating with the Parish Musical Director for the Adult Choir participation and other special music.

Public Relations duties to include information releases for TV, Radio and Newspapers; coordination of TV coverage on the day of the event from KQTV and KNPN; planning a possible "Live at Five" session on KQTV; preparation of personal appreciation certificates; and coordinating streaming video and photography of the entire event will be handled by Len Archer. Final specific details and other assignments will be communicated to the membership at the Tuesday, Apr. 3<sup>rd</sup> Council business meeting. Jean Paul Is United **S**tates Citizen

Jean Paul Mundungu has acclimated rapidly to his new life in the United States. He and his wife and children all became US Citizens in a naturalization ceremony last October in Kansas City, MO.

He is one of the St Francis Xavior parishioners whose native country flag is now displayed in the rafters of Gaspar Hall as someone who now lives here but was born in another country overseas. Jean

Paul comes from the Democratic Republic of the Congo in Africa. He was one of the parishioners who gave Now A presentations about their native country at one of the Lenten Parish Soup Suppers. He gave a very interesting account of how he and his family had to adapt to the culture and lifestyle of this country. He spoke of his need for English language training and his desire to continue his education here. Jean Paul is now working as a Network Administrator for NPG and has recently purchased his first home here.

> He recently also consented to speak at an Interfaith Alliance for Immigrants community forum. About 50 people filled the First Presbyterian Church meeting hall to

listen to panelists Jean Paul Mundungu, the Rev. Tom Russell, Gena Villegas and Nancy Clisbee share their experiences and knowledge of services in their fields.

He said he came to America for his two daughters to have professional careers and opportunities not available to women in his country.

"Ultimately, every American is an immigrant, even those who were born here and whose ancestors came from elsewhere," he said. "I don't believe in luck, I believe in action and prayer and I believe in education, nothing comes easy. It takes time and it takes energy."

We are proud to have a person of Jean Paul's talent, personality and diversity as a member of our Knights Council.
