Knights Group Completes Parish Center Project

A Knights Council 15126 Parish service project that began as a goal for the proceeds of the 2017SFX Wing Ding became a reality this past month with the completion of the SFX Parish Center **Technology Project. Funds** earmarked from the Wing Ding provided the "seed" for additional anonymous donors from the Parish to step forward to provide the funds necessary to make the project a reality. As a result, a team of SFX Knights of Columbus volunteers designed a completely new state of the art audio and video presentation system for the Parish Center, advertised for contractor installation bids. revised bids to accommodate available budget figures, coordinated the purchase of the electronic components, volunteered significant hours towards the final installation and testing of the new system components and are planning to develop documentation materials and procedures to train future Parish users.

Council project volunteers included: Len Archer (Project Coordinator and Installation Planner); Jean Paul Mundungu (Network Administrator); Brian King (Electrical Engineer Installer); Mark Werner (Electrician Installer); Mike Violett (Equipment Installa-

tion); and Dan Deatherage (Equipment Installation). Also serving on this project was Lanham Music Company representative, Aaron Crawford, who was the Digital Equipment Installer and Sound System Consultant.

Initially Miljavac Electric Co. installed two additional dedicated electrical circuits in the ceiling above the two main rooms in the Parish Center to power the new system components. After the new circuits were added and the project planning and equipment ordering phase was completed the actual system physical installation had to be scheduled around the existing schedule of Parish Center activities which required waiting until after the heavily scheduled Easter week. Beginning at 8 am on the Monday after Easter (Apr 2nd) the old system was disconnected by removing the 12 old ceiling speakers and replacing with 18 new ceiling speakers. Two fixed ceilingmounted video projectors were installed along with larger wall-mounted projection screens in each main room. A new WI-FI access point with stronger signal strength and speed was installed in the center of the ceiling in the main room and an Internet connection was extended to the south wall

equipment. New digital sound mixers, and separate room speaker amplifiers were mounted in computer wall cabinets (which only came in black color and had to be power coat painted white locally) along the south ceiling area in each main room near the video projectors and screens to minimize the length of cable connections. Wall-enclosed HDMI plugs were also placed along side of the screens to accommodate electronic input devices. To allow the option of split or combined audio and video use in the rooms required extra cable runs between the two computer wall cabinets.

This system was installed for testing and use at 12:30 AM on the morning of Saturday, April 7th—five days after beginning the install! The Parish Trivia Night used the microphones and projectors that very evening and the Knights Blue Mass Appreciation Reception used them on Sunday afternoon the next day.

The Parish saved in excess of \$10,000 on this single project through the volunteer efforts of this dedicated group of Knights. The committee is now completing work on the documentation materials and procedures for training Parish users on the full range and capabilities of this flexible new audio and video system.

First Responders attended from the St Joseph Police Department, St Joseph Fire Department, St Joseph Mayor, Missouri Troop H Highway Patrol, Buchanan County Sheriff, Andrew Co. Fire Department, Buchanan County EMT and the Savannah Police Department. This Mass was held in conjunction with one of our Council Corporate Communion Masses and member Knights performed all the Mass support roles (Servers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Hospitality Ministers as well as provide support for the 12-member 4th Degree Assembly 569 Knights of Columbus Honor Guard). This Mass was sponsored by the St Francis Xavier Knights Council and the Parish.

First Responders processed into church carrying flags representing the Church, Nation, State and their various departments as they were given a sword salute by the 4th Degree Honor Guard. Their vehicles were on display for parishioners to see in the parking lot. The body of the Mass featured the SFX full adult choir performing traditional and patriotic music, a homily By Fr Joe Miller was tailored to the honorees, and a special blessing was given to the First **Responders before exiting. The** 4th Degree Honor Guard then escorted participants to the reception held in the Parish Center.


