Breaking New Ground with Handi-Helpers

Handi-Helpers broke ground earlier this year with the installation of the garden surrounding the Memorial to the victims of Abortion, but thanks to brother Knight Larry Moore we have broken ground in a whole new way. Larry contacted me regarding brother Knight Myron Willis, who is an 81-year-old retired Air Force Lt Colonel who piloted an RF-4 Phantom fighter during the Vietnam War. He told me that Myron had a heart attack about 3 months ago and needed some help cleaning up his back yard.



When Larry and I arrived at Myron's home we found that we had a great deal of work to do. After our first day working at Myron's, he said that he would give a donation of \$100 to our Knights of Columbus council for our services. We were delighted at his generosity and continued our chain sawing of numerous tree branches, large honeysuckle bushes and pruning and raking almost the entire back yard. We also dug out several pots and assorted items that had gotten buried under all the trees and bushes.



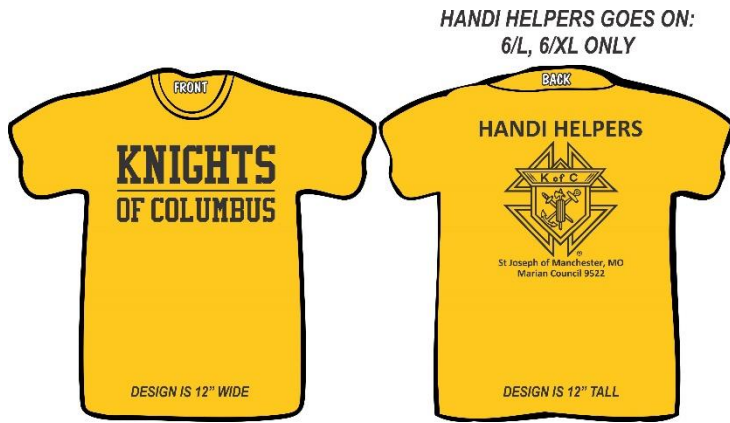
Larry and I have spent parts of 4 days and over 40 hours along with help from Tom Will to get Myron's backyard under control again. The key to completing the project was getting a neighbor of Larry's, Martin Depenthal, who provided his chipper and himself on a no charge basis for over 2 hours to help us shred the massive amounts of branches that we had accumulated in Myron's back yard.



What makes this project a ground breaker for Handi-Helpers is that when the mountain of branches and debris seemed to be at its highest, Myron gave Larry and I not the check he originally promised, but instead a gracious donation of \$500 to our council in care of Handi-Helpers. Larry and I were more than pleased with Myron's generosity and hope that this type of project could lead to additional donations for our council.

Challenger Baseball is a baseball league for kids and adults with developmental disabilities from ages 5 on up. Since 1994 the main goal of St. Louis Challenger Baseball has been to make friends!

The fundamental goal of Challenger Baseball is to make friends. As the players who have disabilities play baseball they have the opportunity to make friends with teammates, who have disabilities, and buddies, who do not have disabilities. Buddies are kids and young adults (between the ages of 10 and 20 who don't have disabilities) who hang out with our players on the field and assist them if they need a bit of help.

How it Works: Beyond following basic safety rules, Challenger tailors certain rules to the skill levels of the players. Challenger players play on the same fields, use the same equipment, and wear the same full uniforms as traditional teams. Teams are supported by coaches and by the buddy system. As the buddies make friends they also help by pushing players using wheelchairs around the base paths after a hit or by helping a player retrieve a ball that's gets past them, among other things. But the most important thing a buddy does is to be a friend to our players.

— Gospel for Sept. 22 (Mk 9:35)

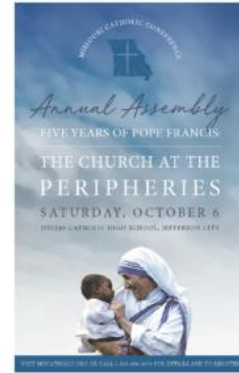
When I was in seminary, I had a roommate who was an early riser. Every morning his loud alarm went off at 5:15, at which point he'd say the same thing: "Gladly, Jesus, gladly!" My comments went in a different direction, let's be honest. In a selfish, me-first world, it's just as hard to hear Jesus say "the first shall be last" as it was to hear my roommate at 5:15. And yet, my brothers, Jesus calls us to be servants of all; to step out of our comfort zone and say "gladly!" as we go to serve others in our lives. "Gladly, Jesus, gladly!"

This month I challenge you to become even more like Jesus, the "servant of all," by making an act of charity for someone in your life from whom you have been distant, or whom you have wronged. Catholics from around the state of Missouri will gather Saturday, October 6, at Helias Catholic High School in Jefferson City for the Missouri Catholic Conference's (MCC) 2018 Annual Assembly. This free event provides the bishops of Missouri an opportunity to meet with Catholics to discuss how citizens can witness to their faith in the public policy arena.

The theme of this year's Annual Assembly is Pope Francis at Five Years: The Church at the Peripheries.

Our keynote speaker will be Bishop Joseph Perry of the Archdiocese of Chicago. He will open our Assembly and is expected to give an inspiring presentation on Pope Francis' papacy to date. Other workshops will address pro-life legislation past and future, the opioid epidemic, and a Catholic response to the LGBTQ community. We have an excellent assembly prepared but our challenge is to make sure Catholics know about the event and attend. We hope you can attend and encourage other Knights to attend. God Bless!

March

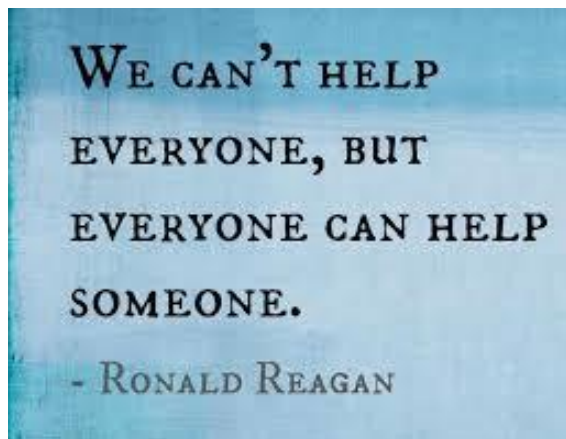
- Handed out basketballs and certificates to parish winners of the Free Throw Basketball Challenge
