Dear Brother Knights:

It is hard to believe that there are only two months remaining in this Columbian Year. Our Spring Membership Church Drives are complete, and councils are following up on turning those prospect cards into signed Form 100s and attendance at Admission Degrees. There has been a marked increase in the number of new brother Knights entering the Order via Admission Degrees which are conducted using the video presentation. This is a good time of the year to contact your Field Agent to review your Insurance quotas to ensure that you are on track for Star Council. A member of the State Membership Team, your District Deputy, or, if necessary, your State Officer are available to assist you in achieving your council goals.

Online Membership went live in New Jersey on February 5, 2018 and the results have been nothing less than remarkable. In less than three months, over 60 men have joined our Order via the Online Membership route. In a change to what was presented at the Regional Grand Knight's meetings in January, if the new Brother Knight has indicated a council that he is interested in joining, his name and contact information will be immediately forwarded to the Grand Knight and District Deputy of the council that was notated on the online application. If you sign that Online Member to complete a Form 100 and participate in an Admission Degree, your council will be credited with a new member towards your Star Council goal. Information related to Online Members will be forwarded to the Grand Knight and District Deputy from Ken Genco, FDD, NJ State Online Membership Chairman.

The New Jersey State Council Convention will be held on May 18 and 19 at the Wildwood Convention Center. Membership Awards will not be distributed at the State Convention and will be presented by the State Officers at local Federation and Chapter meetings in the early Fall. This will allow all councils to work on membership goals until the end of the Columbian Year on June 30. I look forward to seeing many of you in Wildwood...this is a great opportunity to renew friendships and reconnect with Brother Knights from across the state.

Brother Knights,

In order for the State Council to keep track of support for the various programs and to recognize outstanding efforts, on-line reports at www.njkofo.org have been developed for many programs so Grand Knights or Council Chairmen can easily submit data to show your council's level of support. Although many reports are due by 3/31, reporting never actually closes, and activities in this and future months may always be entered. Unfortunately, during this last fraternal year, submissions of reports for many programs were neglected by many councils, and "Autism Awareness and Family Support" (details below) is one program that had no reports submitted by 3/31. So please, show your support for the State Council programs and remind your GK or Council Chairmen to login and submit the appropriate reports at www.njkofo.org.

Autism is the fastest growing disability in this country with the highest incidence rate in NJ where one in 41 persons are born with or develop autism. These families desperately need your support while they struggle with trying to understand their child's needs. They struggle with school systems that don't understand their special learning needs, and with a general public that thinks they don't know how to discipline their child. Through the "Autism Awareness and Family Support Program", the State Council is asking you to support the 501(c)(3) organization Parents Of Autistic Children (POAC) www.poac.net. POAC's mission is to improve the lives of children and adults with autism by providing scientifically-based training to parents, teachers, and other direct-service providers. In addition, POAC provides free recreational events for children and adults with autism and their siblings throughout the year. POAC also provides safety training to first-responders from every NJ county.

INSURANCE MATTERS

When I got my first job teaching at Roselle Catholic high school after graduating from college, my Dad sat me down and gave me some important advice. He said, "Every paycheck you put something away for retirement. It doesn't matter how much, but something needs to be invested in your future." My starting teaching salary was \$6400 a year, with an additional \$400 to be the head coach of three sports, (total not per season), for a total of \$6800 a year, so it wasn't much at first.

So every paycheck I have put something away for the future. It wasn't much at first, since I had rent, car payments, and I had to eat, (it is always about the food). It hasn't always been the same percentage or even the same dollar amount, but it was something. Life had a way of influencing that, (kids, illnesses, mortgage payments, income). But I like most of you have tried to save and am approaching the time when my wife and I would like to sit back and start to relax, sort of smell the roses kind of time. So that leads to my original question.

Live on it or leave it?

That is the question that many of our members are starting to ask themselves (or need to ask themselves). For many of us we have worked our whole lives, provided for our families, planned for what we hope will be a comfortable retirement. We have studied the investment choices, we have contributed to our 401K or IRA religiously to make sure we pay ourselves first, (when we could). We have a nest egg.

Now we need to look at that nest egg and decide are we going to need it to live on, or are we going to lucky enough to be able to leave some of it, (a small part or a big part), for our loved ones? At some point the nest egg is either going to have to provide us with a source of income, (so we can meet our expenses), or it is going to be needed to leave to our spouse, or we may be able to leave a legacy to our kids and grandkids, or to our church or favorite charity.

WEBMASTER

POINT, CLICK, SUBMIT

Since I first designed the State website (www.njkoec.org) in 2005, one of my goals was to make it REALLY easy for Councils to file their reports – on-time / every time.

Every State & Supreme form is available on-line. We eased the security level to access and complete these forms so now, even the Council's Program Chairman can file reports.

It is NOT about the awards at the NJ State Council Convention in Wildwood next month. It is recognizing the hard work by YOUR members.

They are YOUR volunteers who devote blood, sweat and tears to complete the various programs in fulfillment of the Principles of our Order and in support of our Church, Youth and Community.

Filing the required forms also provide your District Deputy, State Officers and Supreme with a finger on your pulse as to how your Council is functioning.

This year we standardized the top part of the form, so it can auto-fill. The bottom part is the specifics of the program. Just a few key strokes and click "submit". From day one, I always said about the website, "If you can work a mouse you can access everything on the website!"



Some State Programs will have ZERO winners recognized this year at the Convention. Some Programs had only one submission – those Councils will be a shoe-in for the award!

I know for a fact that some Councils participated, and made donations, but they filed their forms – hard copy or

electronically.

It is not about the certificate or the engraved plate – it is about those Council members who EARNED that recognition.

Each month there should 342 Knight and Family of the Month submissions. There should be 342 Chaplain of the Year submissions.

All Grand Knight, Financial Secretaries, District Deputies, Faithful Navigators and Faithful Comptrollers should have a password for the state website. If you have not registered by now, please do so by clicking on the link in the top right corner of the website home page. Complete the form, filling out all sections. You should receive a reply email from our Assistant Webmaster John Gazis, FDD, in a matter of days.
