HIGHLIGHTED PROGRAMS OF THE MONTH

Marian Images

At the Supreme Convention held in Baltimore, the Supreme Council announced and previewed a new Marian Image that will be displayed around each Diocese in the state. The new Image is Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. The images are being delivered to each Diocesan Coordinator and should begin traveling the Diocese' this month.

When the Images are delivered to the District Deputy, there will be prayer book, prayer cards and a log book to record the amount of visitors, and the date and location of the veneration of the image. Visitors are permitted to take a prayer card home with them but the prayer books must be collected at the end of the veneration to ensure there are books for future displays. As needed, the <u>Diocesan Coordinator</u> will order more cards and prayer books from Supreme, which are available in English and Spanish. Other languages may be available later in the Columbian year.

It is important that councils provide a program of maximum exposure in their area to include the parish, various church organizations, visits to shut-ins, the needy and to the community as a whole.

The Diocesan Coordinators are implementing a schedule for the image to travel their Diocese and District Deputies are asked to comply with this schedule so all Districts will be able to display this Icon in their area a couple of times this year. Keep Christ Before Us

The "Keep Christ Before Us" program is aimed at increasing the awareness and knowledge of the young people who may be within the range of the activities of the Knights of Columbus. This program is a **year-long program** not to be confused with the Keep Christ in Christmas program that generally runs from the fall through Christmas.

There are three (3) distinct programs in this activity:

1. Christmas and Easter **Coloring** Books (other titles available also)

2. First Holy Communion Book Sets (Boys and Girls)

3. Confirmation Book.

The books are distributed by the Knights of Columbus during each year. They are made available to all councils for all occasions all year, with special emphasis on the Christmas and Easter seasons with the Christmas issue available in Spanish as well as in English.

Councils should contact the program chairman, John Gazis, by **November 1** to order coloring books in time for the Christmas edition, and **March 1** for the Easter edition.

Keep Christ in Christmas Cards

Keep Christ in Christmas (KCIC) is an evangelization program that was launched in 1989 by FDD/Brother Bob Canfield of Roanoke, VA Council 562. Since then KCIC has expanded to 34 states, the provinces of Nova Scotia and Ontario in Canada and Puerto Rico. All orders for NJ Councils are forwarded to the State Chairman with payment for the order. The State Chairman processes each individual order to initiate order fulfillment. All orders are shipped directly to the ordering Council. There are no minimum orders. Currently, in addition to English, cards are offered in Italian, Polish, Ukrainian, Spanish, French and Tagalog, as well as cards with African-American and Native American Madonna and Child depictions. Order forms are available by contacting Chairman Pete Kudless or on the State Council web site. Orders must be received no later than Black Friday after Thanksgiving (November 23, 2019) for guaranteed delivery before Christmas.

Brother Knights,

Please support the many worthwhile programs within Special Programs. <u>SEE LINK></u> Your financial support is critically needed and advance planning of fundraisers will help immensely! These programs will also help you on your council's journey to achieving STAR COUNCIL!

In 1983, President Reagan designated November as "National <u>Alzheimer's Disease Awareness</u> Month". At that time, fewer than 2 million Americans had Alzheimer's; however, today, the number of Americans with the disease has soared to over 5.7 million. And nearly 44 million people have Alzheimer's or a related dementia. The family provides 83% of care delivered at home. Caregiving often has a negative impact on the health, employment, income, and financial security of caregivers. <u>Caregiver Respite Programs</u> provide trained caregivers that attend to an individual in need of care in order to give their primary caregiver time to relax and attend to their own needs.

Just like the Fund Drive for Intellectual Disabilities in April, the NJ State Council is asking all councils to have a fundraiser or to "shake the can" one weekend in November to raise funds for Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite Care. All donations stay in NJ and are used for Caregiver Respite through organizations such as Alzheimer's New Jersey, Caregiver Volunteers of Central NJ, and Parker at Somerset, who provide grants and assistance to families in need. The State Chairmen of this Program, Neal McGarrity, PGK (Northern Councils) and Jack Persia, FM (Southern Councils), will take donations in any amount to attain our goal of \$30,000 for this year. Please see the Grand Knight's Handbook or <THIS LINK> for the counties they serve and where to send your checks. Also, "Regional Walks to Fight Alzheimer's" are coming up: 10/7 ETS in Princeton, 10/13 Liberty State Park in Jersey City, and 10/28 Bergen Community College in Paramus. It's a great day to lace up your sneakers, get in your steps, and raise money for Alzheimer's NJ. After the walk, there's even good entertainment and prizes! Visit www.alzni.org/walk to register and for more details. If you walk and raise some funds, let your State Chairman know for council credit!

We still have aprons for Alzheimer's Fund Drives and they cost just \$16 each. Please add \$5 to the total for shipping. INSURANCE MATTERS

You might find it hard to believe but the toughest competitors we have as insurance agents for the Knights of Columbus are not insurance companies. We have four competitors: Death, Disability, Illness and Old Age. My job is to get to my clients before my competitors do.

The problem with that is that my fifth competitor, the status quo, has already been in almost every home I call on. People are comfortable with what they are doing now and don't always react well to finding out that they are not as well covered as they thought they were, or that they had not even thought about something that could ruin their family life or bankrupt them.

Here is one statistic that every family should check on regularly. Do you know how much you are worth? Your net worth is the one of the best indicators of your financial health, (net worth is the difference between your assets and your debt). Keeping an eye on this number tracks your progress toward meeting your long term financial goals, (a safe and secure retirement?). It also shows areas of opportunity.

With busy lives it is sometimes hard to keep up with all your financial obligations. Sometimes we even may forsake our retirement planning for a more important "need". When in reality that need was a want and it might have been better to put it off for six months or a year and save for it. But in our instant gratification culture, we want what we want and we want it now. Think about setting up a budget that includes important financial dates so that you don't miss an opportunity to save for that something special and you'll still pay yourself first, (or second), so that you will be okay in retirement.

Too many Americans are relying for social security to be a large part of their retirement income. We all have to be better savers, or we face a harsh reality that the government is not going to be able to give us everything we need to be comfortable in retirement, (or maybe not even enough to eat and be warm). Worse yet is that the segment of the population that is falling below the poverty line at the fastest rate is single women over the age of 70, (WIDOWS). As husbands and fathers we need to make sure that what we leave our wives when we go, (and we go first about 70% of the time), will take care of them, not leave them a problem they will have to deal with. For these and many other reasons, it's time to sit with your Knights of Columbus agent.

- 1. Subject line blank e-mail deleted.
