Dear Brother Knights:

Over the past 10 months, I have been discussing the concept of using social media as a means of recruiting new members and our entrance to the Online Membership platform on February 5, 2018 certainly emphasized this concept. As this is certainly the direction that we are headed in for reaching out to perspective members, there is always another proven method that cements the presence of your council in your local parish - the Church Drive. Church Drives have traditionally been held this time of year to correspond with Founder's Day (March 29), but with March 29 being Holy Thursday this year, Church Drives are being held throughout the month of April, and even into May, I would like to review with you the concept of the Church Drive.

#### HOW TO CONDUCT A CHURCH DRIVE

It makes sense to look for new members in the place you're most likely to find them — your parish. One efficient and proven way to do this is to hold a Church Recruitment Drive. Here are steps to success for your event.

#### 1. The Preparation Phase

• Get permission from your pastor to hold a Church Recruitment Drive Weekend after all Masses.

• Contact your council's field agent to get his assistance.

• Advertise the drive in the parish bulletin.

• Order your Church Recruitment Drive Kit in advance.

• Organize your members into teams for the drive weekend. Make sure that enough council members are committed to covering each Mass.

• Conduct a First Degree Ceremonial within one week of the recruitment drive. If necessary, use the First Degree Video Production available via Officers Online.

## Highlighted Programs of the Month

# **Intellectual Disabilities Drive**

In 1975, this program raised \$180,000. In 2015-2016, the councils of New Jersey raised over \$649,000 to be distributed to programs for these citizens. With less government aid allocated to these programs, the importance of private fundraising cannot be overemphasized.

The goals of this program are two-fold: First, to have every council participate in the program as fully as possible, and second, to raise as much as possible to support our special citizens! To ensure that this happens this Columbian Year, we are continuing with a few changes made last year:

1. Although the drive begins in April, it will be a year-round program because councils in different areas of the state are situated differently. (For example, councils in shore and resort areas raise more money in the summer months.) Therefore, you are encouraged to hold different fundraising events (beef and beers, raffles, tricky trays, etc.) that will maximize results. Be creative!

2. Rather than stipulating one specific weekend in April for a drive, April will be "Intellectual Disabilities Drive Month", where we ask the Bishops and Pastors to allow us to collect at all the churches. Councils would have the option of associating this collection with their public collections or having separate times for church and public collections. You should run a Parish Drive in each parish you serve.

3. With such a large sum of money, there are, and must be, regulations for all councils to follow:

a) All money, along with a clearly typed report form, MUST be submitted within three weeks to the State Chairman, Gary Seals.

b) Money may be donated only to BONA FIDE 501(c)(3) CHARITABLE NON-PROFIT PROGRAMS FOR THE INTELLECTUALLY DISABLED IN THE STATE OF NJ. Reminders:

1. All funds are to be reported within three weeks of any fundraising activity.

2. Funds may only be donated to charities and programs serving the intellectually disabled.

3. Use the full legal name of recipients.

4. If you don't specify the recipient, the money will be donated to Special Olympics.

5. Please submit the report form, even if not participating.

Because we have our exemplifications this month, that does not mean we stop recruiting! To the contrary, we should explain the virtues of the 4<sup>th</sup> degree at every opportunity, not just at exemplification times. We should start explaining all the degrees at the 1<sup>st</sup> degree and not just push for the 3<sup>rd</sup> but all the way to the fourth. We should make sure that each Council meeting has a 4<sup>th</sup> degree report and not just pass it by, and at Knighthood degrees that someone speaks about the Patriotic Degree. We should make sure we have 4<sup>th</sup> degree brothers attend and support them at Knighthood degrees. If you take them to the degree, you can talk about the 4<sup>th</sup> degree on the way home from the Knighthood degree! Don't wait till a few weeks before the exemplification and then start, if you always remind them along the way it will be easier to recruit. Remember Supreme has tried to make it easier to increase our membership by changing the dress code to include dark suit, let's take advantage of that. Less than 20% of Knights are 4<sup>th</sup> degree, so there are a lot of recruits out there and remember once we have a 4<sup>th</sup> degree member most of those brother stay for life!

# **INSURANCE MATTERS**

#### Brothers,

A recent study found that 7 in 10 Americans that were over the age of 55 planned on not retiring when they were eligible for "full" social security benefits. That said, many of them are planning on taking the benefit when it is available to them. These discussions have serious short term and long term consequences and can have a significant impact on the surviving spouse.

One item to consider when deciding when you are going to start receiving your social security benefits is that if you take the benefit before your "full retirement age" you will take an 8% cut in the benefit for taking the benefit a year early, and a 32% cut in the benefit for taking it 4 years early. Conversely for every year you wait to take the benefit you get an 8% bonus. So if you have a full retirement age of 67 years old, and you wait to age 70 you get a 24% bonus for waiting. So from that point forward you would get a lot more money.

And it means that your spouse would get that higher benefit for the rest of her life as well. Remember that when one spouse dies, the family loses the lower of the two social security benefits that they are receiving. There are a couple of strategies that we can go over with you to make sure you make the best decision for your personal situation.

Another feature of social security planning is the spousal benefit and how to maximize that. "File and suspend" is no longer an option, but "restricted spousal benefit" is still available under the right conditions and the social security staff is not going to offer it to you, because most of them have not been trained in helping you maximize your benefit. They have been trained on how to get you to file for a benefit. It is up to you to learn how to maximize your own benefit and that's where your Knights of Columbus Field Agent can help.

#### 2. The Implementation Phase

• Arrange for a membership recruitment

announcement to be made before or after Mass.

• Have members, wearing Knights of Columbus branded apparel so they are easily identified, positioned at the entrances of the Church or other appropriate area, to talk to prospects about joining and help them complete a *Membership Document* (#100) or a *Prospect Card* (#921A) if he'd rather learn more about the Knights before filling out a Membership Document.

#### 3. The Follow-Up Phase

• Within 48 HOURS, council members must contact every prospect who completed a *Membership Document* (#100) or expressed interest in joining during the Implementation Phase.

• Inform prospects of the date, time and location of the open house and invite families to attend as well. Also, let them know the date, time and location of the First Degree Ceremonial.

#### What Your Council Needs for a Church Drive

To make your Church Recruitment Drive a success you will need the right tools. Here is a quick guide to what every council might need to have on hand for their recruitment drive:

<u>Membership Document (#100)</u>: This is what it is all about: getting those prospects to sign up and join you as brother Knights. Next stop — the First Degree, and then your prospects and their families can start being active within your council.


**Prospect Cards (#921A):** These 3"x5" cards will help your council collect the contact information on prospects who are looking for more information on your council before completing a Membership Document.
