# **CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE**

Lent is an opportunity to take a step back and evaluate what kind of a Catholic, what kind of a Knight have I been? On Ash Wednesday we received a sobering challenge as the mark of ashes was placed upon us. We either heard, *"Repent and believe in the Gospel,"* or the traditional, *"Remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return."* Both lines are very short but full of profound meaning. More than simply engaging in small acts of sacrifice or *"giving something up"* for Lent, they invite us to a renewal of faith.

Often at funerals I have talked about a story that became a movie, **Tuck Everlasting**. It is about a young girl who encounters a young boy who is a member of the Tuck family. His family was living in seclusion on the property owned by the girl's family because they had discovered the Fountain of Youth. They were immortal, and in order to protect their secret, they lived in hiding. In the background was a mysterious figure who was trying to find them and locate the Fountain. The story becomes a love story and the girl is presented with an interesting decision. She can either drink from the Fountain of Youth, become immortal, joining the Tuck family, or she can return to her normal, mortal life, one day facing death. It is an interesting choice. There is a dramatic moment when the father of the Tuck family has a heart to heart talk with the girl. He tells her to think carefully about her choice. After giving her some pros and cons to consider, he states: *"Don't be afraid of dying, but be afraid of not living."* 

That is a great slogan for the Christian, but also a great way to approach Lent. This season is ultimately not about sacrifice and death, but living--living for God, living our Faith. Too many simply go through the motions, but never achieve what God invites us to, abundant life. So, this Lent, take a look at yourself. Embrace life. Embrace your Faith!

As we approach this Lent, we searched for wisdom from our founder the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney. Below are some excerpts from 13 surviving documents he wrote.

"We have set the wheel in motion, and with willing cooperation in a work that tends so much to our own welfare, we venture to say that soon, very soon, the Order of the Knights of Columbus will hold a prominent place among the best Catholic cooperative corporations in the Union. ... 'Unity and Charity' is our motto. Unity in order to gain strength to be charitable to each other in benevolence whilst we live and in bestowing financial aid to those whom we have to mourn our loss." — Letter to The Connecticut Catholic, Aug. 25, 1883

"The Order of the Knights of Columbus is the same now as when first instituted. viz.: It is an Order composed of Catholics and instituted for the welfare of Catholic families. ... Not only in sickness, but when death takes the support of the family away, the Knights of Columbus comes to the relief of the widow and the orphan in a very substantial manner." — Letter in response to "Clericus" in The Connecticut Catholic, May 30, 1885

Our order is not an organization designed on the "me first" mentality that this world is leaning toward today. During Lent, remember who we are, who we support and where we need to continue to grow. *"For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another."* (Romans 12:4-5) We are Catholic men of faith, we support our church, families and our community. As a fraternal organization, we must stay united and believe we can make a difference in this world. Continue to support and expand our council, our community and our faith.

Dear Parents and Pastors,

Present from almost the beginning of human history, innocent suffering has posed the greatest challenge to humanity. Since we're rational beings, our first response is often to ask "why?" Christians quickly follow that question with a much more difficult one: "How can a loving God allow his greatest creation to experience so much pain and sorrow?"

These ordeals bring us to a decision point: do we quit and succumb to them, become bitter, and discourage others? Or do we persevere and strive to overcome, learning to receive love and give love, thereby encouraging others by our virtuous example? This struggle becomes a contest in which mind, body and spirit are tested—often severely. That is strongly suggested by our language, when we say, "I'm wrestling with this or that problem." For faithful Catholics, the answer should be "Yes" because of our 2,000-year tradition of faithful examples—beginning with Jesus Christ and continuing with his disciples:

- Jesus:....."Blessed are you when men revile you"
- St Paul:....."We rejoice in our suffering"
- St Peter:....."But rejoice in so far as you share Christ's sufferings."

And that tradition lives on in Anthony Ferraro.

Born with a congenital eye malformation that made him legally blind, Anthony had many opportunities to quit over the great frustrations from his handicap—one especially felt during his teenage years. But he had the good fortune to receive that supportive training from his parents and his older brother. He had the additional good fortune of being a wrestler, an endeavor that, perhaps unlike any other, prepared him for the trials and tribulations he would face—on the mat or off—while legally blind. He learned to face them, and overcome them *and himself*, with the help of a devoted coach. 

O great and glorious God, you imbued your holy priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, with deep priestly virtue and especially with pastoral concern for the poor, the orphan, the widow, for the Christian education of youth, for the protection of the faith of the working man of his day.

Now that his priestly ministry continues to spread to countless millions throughout the world through the efforts and influence of the Order of the Knights of Columbus, which Father McGivney founded, we beseech you, Heavenly Father, to raise your faithful servant, Michael, to the honors of the altar. We ask this favor through our Lord Jesus Christ and His holy mother, Mary and our mother.

It is my sad duty to announce the death on Jan. 22, 2019 of the Most Rev. John Mortimer Smith, Bishop Emeritus (2010-2019) and Ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton (1997-2010), former Coadjutor Bishop of Trenton (1995-1997), former Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee in Florida (1991-1995) and former Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark (1988-1991). Bishop Smith died in Morris Hall Meadows, Lawrenceville, after a long illness. He was 83 years old.

Born June 23, 1935, in Orange, to Mortimer and Ethel Smith, both now deceased, Bishop Smith was the oldest of three children with two brothers, the Rev. Andrew Smith, O.S.B., and Gregory Smith. Bishop Smith attended St. Benedict's Preparatory School in Newark, and John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio. He entered Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University in South Orange in 1955 and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961. A graduate of The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Father Smith obtained a doctorate in Canon Law in 1966.

In the Archdiocese of Newark, Father Smith held several positions, among them Assistant Chancellor, Tribunal official, parish priest, Director of the Cursillo Movement and Dean of Bergen County. In 1971, Father Smith was named a Monsignor by now-Pope St. Paul VI.

In 1982, Monsignor Smith was appointed to the faculty of the Pontifical North American College in Rome where he served until his return to Newark in 1986. He was appointed Pastor of St. Mary Parish, Dumont, and, later, as the Archdiocese's Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. On Dec. 1, 1987, he was named Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, and was consecrated Jan. 25, 1988.

Bishop Smith was appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee on June 25, 1991. He returned to New Jersey as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton in 1995 where he succeeded the late Bishop John C. Reiss in 1997. He served as Bishop of Trenton for 13 years until his retirement at age 75 in 2010.

Bishop Smith is survived by his two brothers.

May he rest in peace.
