CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

I think most Catholics are aware of Lent and many of them make sacrifices by giving up something. Sadly, they don't always get the big picture. The whole point of Lent is conversion of heart – in preparation for Easter. Because the emphasis is on Lent, once Easter comes, the same Catholics go back to their usual routine, never realizing that it's now time to rejoice and celebrate!

In that spirit, here is a suggestion for this Easter Season to reflect upon the Resurrection of Jesus. Everyone knows the Stations of the Cross and many will also pray them during Lent. Have you heard of the **Stations of the Resurrection**? They are also known as "Via Lucis," "Stations of Light," or "The Way of the Light." There are fourteen stations, just like the Lenten Stations of the Cross. Every station concerns something that happened between Easter and Pentecost. Here they are and I invite you to pray them as we continue in this Easter Season.

GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

The Knights of Columbus story begins in the winter of 1882 in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn. It was there that our Venerable founder, Father Michael J. McGivney, gathered the men of his parish together to create a solution to the problems of the times. Under his leadership and direction, he knew that if Catholic men banded together, united by charity and unity, they could strengthen their faith, their families, and their communities.

The Knights of Columbus, Annunciation Council 3826, has continued to flourish and progress in all the good works we've done. Because of our order's four core principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism this council has become a pillar in our community.

Now let me give you examples of what has been accomplished and continues today.

For our youth we have donated scholarships to All Saints children to continue their Catholic education and to children and/or grandchildren of council members graduating high school and going onto college. We continued to run Free-throw competitions and Poster Contests and awards and recognition dinners. We provide lunch every summer for St. Mary's Vacation Bible School.

For the families we have provided funds and support for Family Promise, St. Mary's Annual Picnic, Bell Tower Lighting, Legacy of Virtue breakfast and Carnival. We run the St. Mary's Monthly Breakfast to bring together families for a little food and community camaraderie.

For the community we have run many Blood Donation Drives. We supported the Send a Hero Home program to send service men and women home to be with their families during the Christmas holiday. We support the Toy Run Foundations effort to provide for sick and needy children during the Christmas season. We provide funding to Piece of the Puzzle, Autism awareness. During Lent we run with Sweet Jenny's our community Lenten Fish Fry's to support our council charities and scholarship funds. We donated regularly to Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Juvenile Diabetes Association, St. Jude's Children Hospital, Deborah Heart and Lung Center, St. Vincent De Paul and Kens Kitchen to name a few. We have supported individuals with rides to the hospital, visited the sick in nursing homes, assisted the needy with moving and donated our time to assist with cleaning and home maintenance.

For the Culture of Life, we annually provide the bus to the March for Life Rally in Washington DC. We run Rose drives and Baby Bottle program to raise funds to provide for Culture of Life activities. With other Ocean County councils, we provided an Ultra sound machine to the Open-Door Pregnancy Center along with ongoing donation to maintain and train operators. We donated to Rachel's Vineyards. We collected diapers and wipes and donated them to Birth Rite and Open-Door Pregnancy Center.

For our church we have sponsored several seminarians, donate to the "Adopt a Nun" program, participate annually in the Our Lady of Guadeloupe mass, the Blue mass to support our first responders, police, fire and first aid and our military and support our priests at the annual Diocese of Trenton Pride in Priest banquet. We participate and donate in the Trenton Diocesan Foundation Appreciation Supper for our Bishop David O'Connell.

I know there is so much more.

Without **YOU** these events would not have been possible.

May God continue to bless you and your families. Vivat Jesus.




O great and glorious God, you imbued your holy priest,

It is my sad duty to announce the death on Jan. 22, 2019 of the Most Rev. John Mortimer Smith, Bishop Emeritus (2010-2019) and Ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton (1997-2010), former Coadjutor Bishop of Trenton (1995-1997), former Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee in Florida (1991-1995) and former Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark (1988-1991). Bishop Smith died in Morris Hall Meadows, Lawrenceville, after a long illness. He was 83 years old.

Born June 23, 1935, in Orange, to Mortimer and Ethel Smith, both now deceased, Bishop Smith was the oldest of three children with two brothers, the Rev. Andrew Smith, O.S.B., and Gregory Smith. Bishop Smith attended St. Benedict's Preparatory School in Newark, and John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio. He entered Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University in South Orange in 1955 and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961. A graduate of The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Father Smith obtained a doctorate in Canon Law in 1966.

In the Archdiocese of Newark, Father Smith held several positions, among them Assistant Chancellor, Tribunal official, parish priest, Director of the Cursillo Movement and Dean of Bergen County. In 1971, Father Smith was named a Monsignor by now-Pope St. Paul VI.

In 1982, Monsignor Smith was appointed to the faculty of the Pontifical North American College in Rome where he served until his return to Newark in 1986. He was appointed Pastor of St. Mary Parish, Dumont, and, later, as the Archdiocese's Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. On Dec. 1, 1987, he was named Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, and was consecrated Jan. 25, 1988.

Bishop Smith was appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee on June 25, 1991. He returned to New Jersey as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton in 1995 where he succeeded the late Bishop John C. Reiss in 1997. He served as Bishop of Trenton for 13 years until his retirement at age 75 in 2010.

Bishop Smith is survived by his two brothers.

May he rest in peace.
