CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

In this month of August the Church celebrates the Feast of the Transfiguration on August 6. Since it only occasionally falls on a Sunday (this year on a Tuesday) and it is not one of the Holy Days of Obligation, it is easy to overlook. This great event in the life of Jesus (the Fourth Luminous Mystery of the Rosary) is that moment after Peter made his profession of faith in Jesus as the Messiah. Jesus takes Peter, James and John up the mountain. While there, Jesus changed in appearance as His face shone like the sun and Moses and Elijah stood with Him. Through these signs, the divinity of Jesus was revealed to His disciples.

It is interesting to wonder what the apostles thought after this incredible revelation. It is easy to assume that they quickly forgot it by their behavior throughout the ministry of Jesus and it is also obvious that they forgot it at the time of the Crucifixion when they all abandoned Jesus. If they remembered the transfiguration experience, they might have had the courage to remain with Jesus, knowing Who He is.

Rather than looking back and criticizing the apostles, it is more fruitful to challenge ourselves. Have you had any transfiguration moments in your life? I believe everyone has—a moment of prayer, a special time after receiving Communion, a feeling of the Divine that suddenly comes over us, a miraculous event, a sense of peace and comfort in the midst of trial. Each of these are gifts to us, moments when God reveals His presence and His love. Do we remember these transfiguration moments? We should ask ourselves whether or not we then remember them as we go through life. Like the apostles, we can forget or even ignore these moments of grace, failing to trust in the presence and love of God.

I invite you to take some time to recall those transfiguration moments in your life – then take time to make sure that you do not forget. Take them with you in your memory and in your heart, so that when the cross comes, you will remember glory!






O great and glorious God, you imbued your holy priest,

It is my sad duty to announce the death on Jan. 22, 2019 of the Most Rev. John Mortimer Smith, Bishop Emeritus (2010-2019) and Ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton (1997-2010), former Coadjutor Bishop of Trenton (1995-1997), former Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee in Florida (1991-1995) and former Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark (1988-1991). Bishop Smith died in Morris Hall Meadows, Lawrenceville, after a long illness. He was 83 years old.

Born June 23, 1935, in Orange, to Mortimer and Ethel Smith, both now deceased, Bishop Smith was the oldest of three children with two brothers, the Rev. Andrew Smith, O.S.B., and Gregory Smith. Bishop Smith attended St. Benedict's Preparatory School in Newark, and John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio. He entered Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University in South Orange in 1955 and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961. A graduate of The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Father Smith obtained a doctorate in Canon Law in 1966.

In the Archdiocese of Newark, Father Smith held several positions, among them Assistant Chancellor, Tribunal official, parish priest, Director of the Cursillo Movement and Dean of Bergen County. In 1971, Father Smith was named a Monsignor by now-Pope St. Paul VI.

In 1982, Monsignor Smith was appointed to the faculty of the Pontifical North American College in Rome where he served until his return to Newark in 1986. He was appointed Pastor of St. Mary Parish, Dumont, and, later, as the Archdiocese's Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. On Dec. 1, 1987, he was named Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, and was consecrated Jan. 25, 1988.

Bishop Smith was appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee on June 25, 1991. He returned to New Jersey as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton in 1995 where he succeeded the late Bishop John C. Reiss in 1997. He served as Bishop of Trenton for 13 years until his retirement at age 75 in 2010.

Bishop Smith is survived by his two brothers.

May he rest in peace.
