In most cases, its dead silence until next year!


Fr. Stephen Imbarrato states that "we are all complicit, every one of us in the sin of abortion. Yesterday 3,300 babies died, today 3,300 babies will die and tomorrow 3,300 babies will die. What did you do about those babies? We need to wake up every day and ask, not what can I do, but what more can I do? "Blessed John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI said that there is no greater work to be done than to defend human life and "woe to us if we fail".

Is it right to make an extra effort during one month while turning our backs for eleven long months on the little boys and girls who cannot defend themselves? How do you suppose God must feel? How bizarre that animals, plants and mammals have more rights than baby humans. Anyone caught brutalizing an animal the way a child is brutalized would certainly do jail time.

How can we plead ignorance, when abortion has been the law of the land for almost 40 years? How can we plead ignorance when we are living in the age of information? How can we plead ignorance when abortion has been the most controversial and divisive issue even before Roe V. Wade. How can we plead ignorance when we stand before an all-knowing and all-seeing God? Better we get this right, on this side of Heaven, rather than having to fess-up for our sins of omission!

The month of October is annually observed by the Catholic Church in the United States as Respect Life Month. We are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between.

Yet this year, as we approach Respect Life Sunday on October 7, our hearts are heavy with revelations of how those who should be most trustworthy have not only failed in this regard but have inflicted immense evil. As USCCB President Cardinal Daniel DiNardo expressed, 'the Body of Christ is lacerated.'

At such a time as this, we become even more aware of the need for messengers of God's love and instruments of His healing. We realize again, with renewed urgency, our personal call to help others encounter God's transforming, life-giving love and to defend the sanctity of every person's life, at every stage and in every circumstance.

This year's Respect Life theme is "Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent," highlighting our call to build a culture of life as missionary disciples. Drawing upon the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego, this theme is briefly unpacked in a short reflection. I humbly invite you to read and reflect on it this Respect Life Month.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS DISTRICT 68 4TH ANNUAL 9 PIN BOWLING TOURNAMENT

In addition to the main Handicap 9 pin Singles Tournament, we are concurrently running a Scratch 9 pin Team Event. Any council that has five bowlers bowling in the Singles Event on October 5th, 2019, will be able to enter a team for the event. The bowlers will not have to bowl together, be bowling on the same lanes or be bowling on the same shift. There is no additional fee for the council to enter the Team Event. Each council may enter only one team. The bowlers must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a member of the council listing that bowler on the council's team.
- 2. Must be able to show a current paid membership card for their council.
- 3. Has to be listed on the team entry form before 11:00 am on October 5th, 2019
- The bowler must be entered in the Singles Event.

We will take the scratch score of the bowlers listed on the team entry form from whichever shift the individual will be bowling. After both shifts have completed their bowling, we will determine which council has the highest scratch score for the team that they have entered and a winner will be declared. The winning council will be able to claim the traveling trophy until the next tournament at which time the council can defend their title.
