Before that realization, he expressed his annoyance at life through the Newel Post that was always coming lose. It was a symbol of his frustration with his life. After his awakening, he is joyously back home, and while running up the stairs, the Newel Post again came lose. This time, he kisses it and declares how much he loves it.

With his eyes and heart opened, he realized the preciousness of life, even the little things. My prayer is that each us will have a similar awakening through this crisis, and come to realize the blessedness of all those little things, even those things that annoy us from time to time, even people!

My Brother Knights, my Brothers in Christ, I have a question for you.

Where are you today in your faith journey?

Do you struggle with who you are or where you think you should be? You're not alone.

I decided for Lent this year that I would read "The Confessions of Saint Augustine". Saint Augustine is a saint with whom I can relate. He made his share of mistakes. He had someone in his life who prayed for him, prayed that he would find the Truth of our faith. He lived a life in search of what the world could give him or what he could take. He searched for truth in worldly things. Even though God had put these worldly things in his life, he used them for his personal pleasures and worldly ambitions. But once he started to find the Truth that only God could provide, his conversion was astonishing. Below is a small piece from the book, when the Light and Truth of God touched his soul.

"Not with doubtful but with sure knowledge do I love you, O Lord. By your word you have transfixed my heart, and I have loved you. Heaven and earth and all things in them, behold, everywhere they say to me that I should love you. ...What is it then that I love when I love you? Not bodily beauty, and not temporal glory, not the clear shining light, lovely as it is to our eyes, not the sweet melodies of many-moded songs, not the soft smell of flowers and ointments and perfumes, not manna and honey, not limbs made for body's embrace, not these do I love when I love my God.

Yet I do love a certain light, a certain voice, a certain odor, a certain food, a certain embrace when I love my God: a light, a voice, an odor, a food, an embrace for the man within me, where his light, which no place can contain, floods into my soul; where he utters words that time does not speed away; where he sends forth an aroma that no wind can scatter; where he provides food that no eating can lessen; where he so clings that satiety does not sunder us. This is what I love when I love my God."

Saint Augustine would be Bishop of Hippo Regius in North Africa, an early Christian theologian and a doctor of the Catholic Church.

Where you are today in your faith journey is right where you need to be. Search for Him. He is and always has been within you. God loves you, today, tomorrow and always. Find your own personal way of bringing Him out into this world, and into your life. God knows we need Him; we need Him more than ever in this world.


