As we close out the third quarter of our Fraternal Year, with two dates remaining for our Annual Lenten Fish Fry, the efforts of all the volunteers involved are paying great dividends. In comparison to last year, with expenses and total meals served being less, our profits, to date, are greater. Special recognition goes to Brother Stan Rocush and the team he formed. Under his leadership and with little fanfare, our Lenten Fish Fry is enjoying another season of success. I would like to thank all who have thus far volunteered their time to insure that success. It is because of your individual efforts that the council will be able to support our charitable causes.

This year our Council will be represented, for the first time, at the State Basketball Free Throw 14 year old Championship, by Julia Kavcar from Holy Angels School. That participation would not have been possible without the voluntary efforts of Brothers Joe Didier, Russ Huggins, Ron Kruse and Joe Vagnoni during the local, district and regional contests. Thanks to Brother Dean Myles for chairing this year's blood drive on March 1. With the assistance of five Knights, seven donors provided 16 Units of much needed blood, to the Heartland Blood Center. Brother Dean also managed our eyeglass collection, which secured 154 pairs of eyeglasses, to be reworked for distribution to the needy. Brother Bill Dugan, reports very good donations, for the 40 cans for lent collection, to support the food pantry and the support of military veterans was possible, by contributions raised during our pancake breakfasts' and poinsettia sale, which allowed for the purchase of seven wheelchairs (one more than last year) through the American Wheelchair Mission.

I mention these Council activities for two reasons. First, to highlight the important role the individual efforts of our Bellarmine Ladies, Squires and Brother Knights play in support of our council events. Second, to remind each of you that your council needs your support to sustain the on-going charitable efforts in service to our church and community. If you have helped, in any way, to support these charitable causes, I thank you and if circumstances has thus far prevented your volunteer efforts in our charitable causes, do not worry because there will be many additional opportunities for you to offer your time and talent to your council.

As we enter our final quarter of this Fraternal Year, membership remains at the forefront of our requirements. As we find ourselves within several weeks of the end of Lent, this is a good time to reflect on what special actions we are employing as part of our Lenten efforts to grow in our faith and discern if we might try to continue any of them after the conclusion of these forty days. There are some who may have abstained from a particular habit for Lent, i.e. smoking, liquid refreshments, deserts, TV shows, special entertainment, and the list goes on Hopefully we have been successful in our efforts and it could be beneficial to continue by at least controlling some of those habits we may have followed without limit before Lent began; part of the benefits could be improved health or better use of time and treasure, making it part of our daily offering for some good and holy purpose. The following excerpt is from a homily on the Gospels by Saint Gregory the Great, pope, and may help us in our reflection:

"I would like to urge you to forsake everything, but that I do not presume to do. Yet, if you cannot give up everything of this world, at least keep what belongs to the world in such a way that you yourself are not kept prisoner by the world. Whatever you possess must not possess you; whatever you own must be under the power of your soul; for if your soul is overpowered by the love of this world's goods, it will be totally at the mercy of its possessions. In other words, we make use of temporal things, but our hearts are set on what is eternal."

May the Holy Spirit enable us in our discernment while providing the Grace necessary to maintain control over those habits that would seek to control us. God bless you.

Membership News

Duties of a Proposer

Proposing a new member is a commendable achievement and one to be proud of. However, as a proposer, turning over a completed Membership Document (#100) is not the end of the job. You must also take the responsibility to see that your recruit becomes fully accepted by his fellow council members and stays involved in council activities. There are several steps you can take to ensure this.

- Explain to him that the council's Admission Committee will examine his qualifications for membership and accompany him to the Admission Committee meeting. Introduce him to the members present.
- After he has been accepted, escort him to his First Degree and remain with him throughout the event. Following the exemplification, introduce him to his fellow council members.
- Take the newly initiated member and his family "under your wing". See that he learns council procedures, such as meeting times, committee assignments, etc. Introduce him and his family at council events. Encourage him to involve his family in council-sponsored activities.
- Accompany your recruit to his Second Degree and Third Degree exemplifications and stay with him throughout the day.
- Contact him before each council meeting and bring him to the meeting if necessary. If the new member becomes inactivate for some reason, try to find out why. Call and ask to visit with him. Explain your concern about his absence and offer support or assistance.
- Encourage him to earn "Shining Armor" status within the council.

If the Knight becomes inactive, his proposer should work with the retention committee to find out the reasons for his lapsed interest and try to converse his membership.

With a little personal effort you can help guarantee that your recruit becomes an active member of the Knights of Columbus.

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
