# Deacon's Beacon

Dear Brother Knights,

Our Lenten journey for this year has now ended and although the following was written during the Lent of 2010, I believe continues to be relevant. My hope is that the spiritual growth we experienced during our recent Lenten time will continue to provide progress in holiness.

I never cease to be amazed by how God can do so much with so little; I say this after reflecting on some of the Scripture found recently in the Liturgy of the Hours prayers. For example: "A man can only reap what he has sown. If you sow in the field of selfishness, it will bring you a harvest of death and decay; if you sow in the field of the Spirit, you will reap a harvest of life everlasting" (from St. Paul to the Galatians, Chapter 6). Then in another: "Never allow yourself to be self-satisfied; if you pride yourself on your worldly wisdom, you will have to unlearn it all before you are truly wise; worldly wisdom is foolishness in the eyes of God" (from St. Paul to the Romans, Chapter 12, and also his letter in 1 Corinthians, Chapters 1 & 3).

Isn't it fascinating how God's Word can be brief and yet easily understood, certainly contrary to much of what we might read and hear in today's worldly culture, which too often it seems the intention is to lead us to be confused.

And as long as we're on this topic, here's a little more wisdom from St. Paul to the Galatians, Chapter 6: "...., the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law."

If you're one of those still trying to decide what additional prayer and reflection you can do during this Lenten season, might I suggest reading some of St. Paul's letters; and be forewarned: be prepared to be encouraged, refreshed, inspired, and perhaps convicted. My hope and prayer is that we can be open and receptive to whatever the Holy Spirit might have for us. And may God bless you.



### MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

### THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
