My hope is that you will now respond to this encouragement and if you do, here is some of the wisdom you will find:

"My son, if you receive my words and treasure my commands, turning your ear to wisdom, inclining your heart to understanding,then will you understand the fear of the Lord; the knowledge of God you will find. For the Lord gives wisdom, from his mouth come knowledge and understanding; He has counsel in store for the upright, he is the shield of those who walk honestly, guarding the paths of justice, protecting the way of his pious ones." Prv. 2: 1-2, 5-8

"...., forget not my teaching, keep in mind my commands;Trust in the Lord with all your heart, on your own intelligence rely not; in all your ways be mindful of him, and he will make straight your paths. Be not wise in your own eyes, fear the Lord and turn away from evil," Prv. 3: 1, 5-7

"Happy the man who finds wisdom, the man who gains understanding." Prv. 3: 13

"Hear, O children, a father's instruction, be attentive, that you may gain understanding. Yes, excellent advice I give you, my teaching do not forsake." Prv. 4: 1-2

"Get wisdom, get understanding! Do not forget or turn aside from the words I utter. Forsake her not, and she will preserve you; love her, and she will safeguard you. The beginning of wisdom is: Get wisdom; at the cost of all you have, get understanding." Prv. 4: 5-7

"So now, O children, listen to me, go not a stray from the words of my mouth." $\;$ Prv. 5: 7

"The scoundrel suffers the consequences of his ways, and the good man reaps the fruit of his paths." Prv. 14: 14

"The wicked man's schemes are an abomination to the Lord, but the pure speak what is pleasing to him. He who is greedy of gain brings ruin on his own house, but he who hates bribes will live." Prv. 15: 26-27

"By justice a king gives stability to the land; but he who imposes heavy taxes ruins it." Prv. 29: 4



THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
