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# Deacon's Beacon

Dear Brother Knights,

The following was written for our church Bulletin in August 2004, but of course still relevant; may it provide some "food" for your journeys in faith:

"How many fish are in the ocean?" I'm reminded of that question when asked, "How should I pray?" or "What is the best way to pray?" Just as the question about the fish would probably have me provide an answer of "many," there are certainly many ways to pray, to be "in touch" with our Lord, and perhaps the answer for "What is the best way to pray?" lies in what seems to work best for each of us, what way provides the refreshment, encouragement, and inspiration we seek. Following is one, simple suggestion:

Begin by being humble before the Lord, by being on our knees before a crucifix (if still able to kneel). This can be in a bedroom, resting our elbows on the bed, or any room that can provide the quiet atmosphere necessary for giving the Lord our attention. I am used to beginning with the salutation, "Good Morning Father, dear Holy Spirit, dear Jesus, Mary and Joseph, and all the Saints and Holy Angels, and especially my guardian angel, a grand and glorious "good morning" to all of you. Thanks and praise for blessings, prayers of intercession for particular intentions, for people with special needs, for the conversion of sinners, for peace, for the Holy Father, bishops, priests, deacons, seminarians, and religious, can follow. Our morning prayer should include an offering of the day; offering our prayers, works, joys and sufferings, for some good and holy intention, and then to be thought of as our day progresses. And, of course, let us always be asking forgiveness for the ways we have offended our Lord.

I see this type of prayer as "Prayer of the Heart;" simply talking to our Lord about what is on our heart and need not be confined by what is listed above. The important part is that we have this quiet time with our Lord on a daily basis; that we develop a discipline in our daily routine that includes a time for, at least, morning and evening (or night) quiet prayer (especially in the morning before we venture out into "the world.") May the Holy Spirit lead us to the prayer in which we discover the love, joy and peace that only He can provide. God bless you.

### THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
