Deacon's Beacon

Brother Knights,

This month I share with you a column written for our parish bulletin in February 2004 that attempted to emphasize the importance of having some quiet prayer time at the beginning of our day; it was relevant in 2004 and always will be. My hope is that it will provide inspiration and especially motivation to "make it happen!"

In previous columns I've tried to stress what I believe to be a very important, and too often omitted, activity in our search for a more intimate union with God. The activity I refer to is our spending some quiet, quality time with our Lord before we leave the house to begin the work day or before we begin the busy activities of tending our homes. As encouraged in other columns, if we can give even a few minutes, at least in the beginning, our Lord can provide miracles through it just as He did with the fishes and loaves in the Gospel. The more people I talk to about prayer and praying, the more I'm convinced the lack of at least saying "Good Morning!" to Him and having just a few minutes with Him before beginning the day's activities is the greatest stumbling block toward finding the peace He wants us to have. In an effort to encourage all those not yet experiencing that quiet time, the following are brief, yet pious, examples of Morning Offering prayers that require little time, yet carry much spiritual power when prayed in the quiet of a docile and reflective heart:

"O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my relatives and friends, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father." Amen.

"O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings, all that this day may bring, be they good or bad: for the love of God, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for all the sins committed against Your most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Your Mother, Mary." Amen.

"Lord God Almighty, You have brought me safely to the beginning of this day. Defend and protect me today by Your mighty power, that I may not fall into sin, but that all my thoughts, words and actions will be pleasing to You." Amen

"Heavenly Father, I offer to You this day, all my prayers, works, joys and sufferings, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, for the fulfillment of her intentions." Amen.

These are but examples for beginning our days; they can be prayed word for word or to provide inspiration for prayer offerings from our hearts. The important thing is that we take that short, or longer, time to acknowledge our Lord, to greet Him, to offer, to pray. May the Holy Spirit minister to each of us during these quiet moments.

"Dear Holy Spirit, lead me to a quiet time before I get busy."

The 24 hour Knight

Today's men face many commitments. From his duty to his family to his obligation to his work place, there are constant calls on his time. How many times have your council's recruiters heard the reply: "I don't have much time to give to the Knights, so why should I join?" It's a common concern among many prospects that they just don't have the time to be a part of the Knights of Columbus.

Imagine if you were able to tell a man that if he could just give 24 hours a year to the Knights of Columbus he could make a positive difference in his community and Church. Below is an illustration of just how little time it takes to be an active part of the Knights of Columbus. Even with this minimal commitment he can be an important part of a council and reap the benefits of what membership in the Knights of Columbus has to offer him and his family. When talking to a prospect about joining our Order, try breaking down the time commitment in this way:

- 12 hours a year reading the weekly parish bulletin, the state and local council newsletters, Columbia magazine, and surfing the state council and Supreme Council Web sites
- 2 hours a year volunteering at the council's annual drive for people with intellectual disabilities
- 2 hours a year attending, with his family, two council corporate Communions or prayer services at the parish.
- 2 hours a year on a council-sponsored Church, community, council family or youth project of his choosing.
- 2 hours a year attending one council meeting. (If it's a well-run interesting meeting he
 might even come back for a second.)
- 4 hours a year enjoying (again, with his entire family) a council social function such as a dinner, dance, picnic, etc.

When you present the time commitment of joining the Knights of Columbus to a man is this way, it doesn't seem very intimidating at all. Once a man becomes a member and sees how rewarding being a part of the Knights of Columbus is, he'll want to dedicate more of his time to the Order.

If your council doesn't conduct some of the types of programs mentioned above, consider implementing them or similar ones. If your council doesn't have a newsletter consider starting one — there is no better way to keep your members informed and active.

There are 8,760 hours in a year. By giving the Knights of Columbus 24 of those hours (less than .3 percent), a man can be a better Catholic, a better father, a better husband and a better person. Think of the difference the Knights of Columbus can make in our communities if these men join us. We only have to let each qualified prospect know that he has the time to join and make a difference in his community and the Church in just 24 hours.



MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
