Dear Brother Knights,

The following was written for our Church Bulletin in December 2003, based on a message given by our Blessed Mother in Medjugorje; I submit her message is still relevant, if not more-so now than in 2003. My hope is it will provide much "food" for consideration and discernment.

Following is the monthly message given by the Blessed Mother to the Medjugorje visionary, Marija, on November 25, 2003.

This is her message to the world, to all of us:

"Dear children! I call you that this time be for you an even greater incentive to prayer. In this time, little children, pray that Jesus be born in all hearts, especially in those who do not know Him. Be love, joy and peace in this peaceless world. I am with you and intercede before God for each of you. Thank you for having responded to my call."

Once again, as in most of her messages, and especially during this Advent time, the Blessed Mother is calling us to prayer, to be praying people. She even tells us what to pray for as she says, "pray that Jesus be born in all hearts, especially in those who do not know Him." She tells each of us to "be love, joy and peace in this peaceless world." The Blessed Mother doesn't suggest or recommend, she tells us to do these things, and at the same time reminds us that she is with us and intercedes before God for each of us. Can we fully comprehend all this? Can we understand that the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Holy Mother of God is with each of us and is praying for us as individual children of God? She knows our failings, she knows our needs, she knows our strengths, and so she prays for us. Pretty awesome, isn't it? As we journey thru this time of Advent in preparing to celebrate the birth of our Savior, let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us let go of, to give up those things that prevent us from being love, joy and peace to others, and those things that prevent us from being prayerful. May we always remember: "He, Jesus Christ, is the reason for the Season."

"Dear Holy Spirit, may Jesus be born in a truly personal way in my heart, in the hearts of those around me and in the hearts of those throughout the world; may we look to Him to experience the love, joy and peace that only He can provide."



THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
