Dear Brother Knights,

Following is a column written for our Church Bulletin, weekend of January 30 -31, 2010, and of course, still relevant. May it provide some "food" for thought:

We'll continue this week with another short inspiration found in Mother Angelica's book, Little Book of Life Lessons and Everyday Spirituality, edited and with additional material by Raymond Arroyo, published by Doubleday. This inspiration is entitled, Selling Out For Peanuts:

In late 1967, ever the entrepreneur, Mother Angelica was on the lookout for a new venture to pay down the debt of her Birmingham monastery. The fishing lure business that had financed the property had literally gone south by that point.

Introduced to peanut roasting by a friend, Mother felt inspired, and the Li'l Ole Peanut Company was born the following week in a monastery workroom. For almost five years, the nuns of Our Lady of the Angels churned out roasted peanuts and turned a healthy profit, until Mother's conscience was violated.

"We used to roast peanuts at the monastery. We did five tons a month and had big concessions. Our concessions changed and the new guy came to me and said, "Mother, I would love to continue giving you the peanut concession."

I said, "Fine." Then he said, "Of course, there will be a small fee." "Like what?" I said. He said, "Well, you know, an advertising fee." "How much?" I asked. "About \$1,000. dollars a year." I said, "That's a kickback." He looked at me like he didn't think nuns knew that. He must have thought all nuns were idiots. Don't go by appearances, because I'm from an Italian family. My grandpa had a saloon. So I said, "That is a kickback and I don't pay kickbacks." "You lose me and you're as good as out of business," he said. "That's okay. I don't need it. Look buddy, if I'm going to hell, it's not going to be on account of a peanut!" I said. What's the peanut in your life? We all begin by silencing our conscience, looking the other way, putting aside this principle or that. And one day you look back and you've sold your soul for a peanut. Doesn't matter what it is, it's all peanuts compared to the value of your soul."

I don't know about you, but I can think of many examples in our culture of those who seem to be selling their souls for "peanuts." One of the first examples that comes to mind would be those in positions of authority who support abortion on demand in order to obtain financial and ballot support in order to obtain or retain positions of authority. But lest we look only at others, we must also look at ourselves and determine where we stand on critical issues and who or what we support regardless of the issues they might promote. May each of us make time with the Holy Spirit for some self-examination. God bless you.

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
