Following is a column from our Bulletin of February 14, 2010, and of course still relevant. I hope you will find it helpful in your preparation for the coming Lenten season:

In case you haven't heard, we are only a short time away from Ash Wednesday, the day I believe can be considered as the "door" that opens to a tremendous time of "opportunity," that being the time of Lent. I see it to be a time when we should do additional prayers (i.e. praying the Rosary, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, making novenas, attending Stations of the Cross, reading Sacred Scripture, spending time in quiet reflection, attending daily Mass, if possible, etc.) and especially to include some form of fasting. Following are some excerpts from Joe Difato, publisher of the Word among us Scripture commentary in his letter found in this Lenten issue regarding the importance of fasting:

"Recently, I saw a bumper sticker that read: 'What you are is God's gift to you. What you become is your gift to God.' The more we realize the magnitude of the gift that God has given to us, the more we will want to grow closer to him and give him a great gift. As we were praying and asking the Lord what we should write about this Lent, we thought the Spirit was telling us: 'Call for a fast.' We felt that he wanted us to take the first reading for Ash Wednesday and expand upon it and explain it. And so we have.

As we prayed, we kept reflecting on the power that prayerful fasting has to unite us as a church, We were struck by the way that fasting helps us be more open to God's guidance in our lives. And we thought

about the Bible stories that show how physical self-denial can bring about spiritual insight and heavenly grace.

......So as we begin this Lenten season, we want to urge all of you to join with us and 'proclaim a fast' in your own homes. Together, let's make fasting a part of the gift we give back to the Lord this Lent.

No matter how you decide to fast this Lent, be sure that you do it in conjunction with prayer, repentance, and the Eucharist. Do the best you can to live out your fast, and leave the rest in the Lord's hands. Jesus sees what we are doing as we fast, and it pleases him. He knows how much we want to draw close to him. He knows the obstacles that we face in fulfilling this goal. And he will help all of us as we seek his presence."

For those of us who subscribe to the Word among us, those who get a complimentary copy or read it on the Internet, be sure to read the short stories in the beginning portion of the booklet to learn more about the spiritual benefits of fasting. My hope is that something we experience this Lent may have a lasting effect on our spiritual growth. May God bless you.

- Build a Prospect List
 - Include local priests, ushers, parish council members, choir members, lectors, new parishioners, and vendors and don't forget family members.
- Recruit Using 2 on 1 Concept
 - o Organize two-man recruitment teams (can be a husband/wife team)
- Hold A Church Drive
 - Obtain pastor's approval for a membership drive suggest having your drive on a Community Sunday and provide donuts/pastries.
- Conduct an Open House
 - $\circ~$ "Exhibit your products" and what your Council and the Order have to offer.
- Organize and In-House Open Houses
 - Host an open house in a member's home; invite husbands and wives.



MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
