### Grand Knight Line

Brother Knights,

As we move into the second month of the New Year, we have some things to reflect on as Knights. While not trying to get political and strongly believing that, as Americans, our right to vote for whomever we wish is a right guaranteed by our Constitution, I ask you all to consider what we have as elected representatives not only on the national level but on the local level as well.

Do we have officials that truly care about us? Do we have officials that protect the rights of the unborn? If not, then we need to work to get officials who are supporting us and the rights of the unborn.

Fr. Canova had in his homily recently that perhaps we should change displaying the Ten Commandments in all schools and public buildings and we displayed the nine "BLesseds" of the Beatitudes in these places.

Just think how different our world would be if we were all "merciful" or all "peacemakers" or as he so well stated, "Imagine the church we would become if the ninth beatitude became our mission statement: Blessed are you when you are insulted and persecuted because of me...rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven."

I believe it is our job as Knights to help all people, young and old, know more about their faith so that all of us will become better evangelizers.

As we continue to help one another, I would like to thank the Brothers who were recently involved in the Pasta for Priesthood, the Coat Drive, the Soccer contest, the Free throw Contest and the help and information I received from our District Deputy on the recent Essay Contest and "Keep Christ in Christmas" contest and to those who will be helping with the Lenten Fish Dinners. We need to continue to involve all the members of our Council in as many activities that they can handle.

You've received emails regarding the health of some of our members. Remember we all need prayers. We all try to do the best we can and we can only help to get better if we learn from the past and continue to try to do better in the future.

Our parish is one of the best in the Rockford Diocese and because of all the work that so many people do, whether Knights or not, we will need to be there for each other and especially for our young people who are growing up in a world that seems to be ignoring basic Christian values and respect for each other.

As one of the Popes had as his motto, "I am a first among equals". Let us work on helping each other use the various gifts we all have. No matter what we have done in the past, good or bad, we can make all our experiences "learning" experiences and do the best that Christ would have us do in our daily lives.

Dear Brother Knights,

The following is a column written for our Church Bulletin in January 2010, and of course, still as relevant as ever; my hope is we will do some self-examination and respond as necessary:

In past columns I've shared with you how refreshing I find it to read something that is truly Christian, be it the Bible, the life or writing of a saint, prayers found in the liturgy of the hours, short inspirations or books written by those who have made some progress in their faith journey, whether lay or religious. Following is a short inspiration found in Mother Angelica's book, *Little Book of Life Lessons and Everyday Spirituality*, edited and with additional material by Raymond Arroyo, published by Doubleday.

The inspiration is entitled, A Slow Fall:

"All falls are gradual. Man is not like a stone rolling downhill.

Man falls very slowly – almost unconsciously. He slips gradually, over a long period of time. We are creatures of habit, and if we have acquired a habit of goodness, it is difficult to fall quickly. The fall usually comes bit by bit. It's like daily prayer. Things crowd in on you, so you cut it short. The next day you skip it. You keep this up for days, and weeks, and months, and the first thing you know you have stopped praying altogether. It has been so gradual, and now you have so many things to do and so many places to go, prayer is a torture. If it isn't practiced regularly, sanctity can slip away in the same fashion."

I hope each of us has resolved to do more reading of inspirational material during this New Year; and let us not delay in beginning. We never know what the Holy Spirit might have for us. May you be refreshed and inspired. God bless you.

### THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
