

Dear Brother Knights,

Following is a column written for our church bulletin in January 2008, and of course, still relevant; may it provide some "food for thought" and spiritual guidance:

Believe it or not, we have now begun another New Year, the year of 2008!Although it's a wise decision to be continually assessing our progress on spiritual and worldly goals, the beginning of a new year is a special time for reflecting on "what we have done and what we have failed to do·" Very often new goals (resolutions) lean toward improvements in our physical condition, finances, employment, times for relaxation, etc·, but we must remember to include some things to help us grow in our faith, things to draw us closer to our Lord and increase our trust in Him; truly, establishing goals for making progress in our faith journey and then striving to accomplish those goals can be **the most important, and life-changing** things we can do· Here's a few suggestions for consideration:

Have some quiet time for prayer and reading the Bible every day Read Christian books, magazines and newspapers Listen to Catholic radio (Relevant Radio, 930 AM) and watch Catholic TV (EWTN on Comcast channel 119). Make a retreat (Marriage Encounter, Cursillo Weekend, a quiet or guided retreat at a retreat center, etc.). Review the daily routine. Treat and relate to others in a positive way. Add new names and intentions to the daily prayer list. Read the Bible. Plan to do something special during the coming Lenten season (less time with "sit-coms," more time with our Lord). Go to Confession often, pray outside the Planned Parenthood facility, and the list goes on ......

Whatever we choose, the important part is that we decide **to do something;** and may the Holy Spirit guide us in our choices while motivating us to action. Wishing each of you a Happy and Holy New Year!

# Membership News

### Keep a Star Council Mindset

Our Star Council Award winners are the leaders of our Order in the areas of membership, insurance promotion and service programs. They are councils that have adopted the mindset to be successful in membership recruitment, insurance promotion and charitable works.

To be eligible to earn the Star Council Award, a council must qualify for the Father McGivney, Founders' and Columbian awards. To qualify for these awards, your council must also submit the *Survey of Fraternal Activity* (#1728) and the *Service Program Personnel Report* (#365).

To earn the Columbian Award, your council must complete and submit the *Columbian Award Application* (#SP7), which may be found in the *Council Report Forms Booklet* (#1436) or at kofc.org/forms. Remember, you can track your progress toward the award by using the *Star Council Checklist Poster* (#5104).

Councils must conduct and report at least four major programs in each of the Service Program categories (Church, Community, Council, Family, Culture of Life and Youth). Or, as an alternative, councils may conduct a single featured program in each category, thereby fulfilling all requirements for that category. The featured programs and their respective categories include the following: Refund Support Vocations Program – RSVP (Church), Habitat for Humanity or Global Wheelchair Mission (Community), Special Olympics (Council), Food for Families (Family), Ultrasound Initiative or a March for Life event (Culture of Life) and Coats for Kids (Youth).

### THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
