The following is a column written for our Church Bulletin in January 2006, reminding us of the importance of spending daily quiet time with our Lord in order to help us grow in our relationship with Him; my hope, and prayer, is that we will respond to what is suggested and then be able to experience the love, peace and joy it can provide.

Welcome to a New Year, the year 2006! And isn't this the time we take a look at what we've done and what yet needs to be done? It's that common time for making, or at least thinking, about resolutions for the new year. I believe part of the reflection for Monday, December 26th (the Feast Day of St. Stephen, the first martyr), in *The Word Among Us*, provides some helpful suggestion for us in this task and so it follows:

"During this time after Christmas, which can be anti-climactic, we tend to consider resolutions of how we will change in the new year. Can we decide to stay close to the presence of God a little bit more next year? Can we resolve to spend time with him every day so that we will be open to his Spirit during whatever challenges or crises we may face? This may involve a decision to pray every day, but it also means inviting Jesus into our thoughts during the day. It means sharing with him the frustrations, guilt, and fears – as well as the joys and surprises – of the day. Like St. Stephen, the more we walk with Jesus in our everyday lives, the more powerfully we will experience him when we face a test."

None of us look forward to the "tests" that may come along, but most likely there will be some; hopefully they won't be too severe, and yet we seldom know what the future holds for us. Franciscan priest, Father Michael Scanlan, T.O.R., in his book, *Appointment With God*, begins the book by writing, "The most important thing in life is our relationship to God, and the most important means of nurturing that relationship is daily prayer." What better resolution could we possibly make than to spend some daily quiet time with our Lord, talking to Him and allowing Him to talk to us through Holy Scripture and/or inspirational reading, when, as Fr. Scanlan says, "the most important thing in life is our relationship to God?" Granted, this can be a tough resolution to implement in our busy lives but it's one that pays huge dividends.

May the Holy Spirit lead us to **make** some daily quiet time (chances are we won't be able to **find** the time, so we have to **make** the time) with Him in this New Year; and may we experience God's grace and blessings as a result of it.

"But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given you besides." Mt. 6:33



MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
