Brother Knights,

Psalm 95 is one of those included in praying the Liturgy of the Hours Morning Prayer and is, of course, as relevant for us today as it was for the Israelites of Old Testament times. Following are the words I believe shout loudly to our culture; they call us to Praise and ObedienceI hope we are listening:

"Come, let us sing to the Lord and shout with joy to the Rock who saves us. Let us approach him with praise and thanksgiving and sing joyful songs to the Lord. The Lord is God, the mighty God, the great king over all the gods. He holds in his hands the depths of the earth and the highest mountains as well. He made the sea; it belongs to him, the dry land, too, for it was formed by his hands.

Come, then, let us bow down and worship, bending the knee before the Lord, our maker. For he is our God and we are his people, the flock he shepherds. Today, listen to the voice of the Lord: Do not grow stubborn, as your fathers did in the wilderness, when at Meriba and Massah they challenged me and provoked me, although they had seen all of my works. Forty years I endured that generation. I said, 'They are a people whose hearts go astray and they do not know my ways.' So I swore in my anger, 'They shall not enter into my rest.'

I hope all of us will make time to reflect on the words of this Psalm, allowing the Holy Spirit to show us how very relevant they remain.

Would you not agree our culture has its own "Meriba's" and "Massah's" in which we challenge and could very well provoke our Lord?


Do we not daily see examples of those "whose hearts go astray" and do not know His ways, or are even concerned that they do not know His ways?

You must tailor these strategies to your own council's needs. Call upon your State Membership Team if you have any questions or difficulties. (See the Supreme Council's booklet entitled "Conducting a Membership Drive" -- # 10098.)

- · Organize Your Membership Committee and Set Your Goals
 - Select Knights who are dedicated and enthusiastic
 - Set membership goals to exceed quota, achieve Star Council (again), break previous records, etc.
- · Build a Prospect List
 - Include local priests, ushers, parish council members, choir members, lectors, new parishioners, and vendors and don't forget family members.
- · Recruit Using 2 on 1 Concept
 - o Organize two-man recruitment teams (can be a husband/wife team)
- · Hold A Church Drive
 - Obtain pastor's approval for a membership drive suggest having your drive on a Community Sunday and provide donuts/pastries.
- Conduct an Open House
 - o "Exhibit your products" and what your Council and the Order have to offer.
- Organize and In-House Open Houses
 - o Host an open house in a member's home; invite husbands and wives.

MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
