Brother Knights, Following is a column written for our Sunday Bulletin in February, 2006; I recognize it's rather "dated" but hope you'll find it still very relevant, and beneficial:

Looking through a collection of resource materials last week, I came across an article from New Covenant magazine (no longer published), the March 1993 issue. The article was written by Bill Dodds and entitled, *Lent and Lazarus*, and of course is in reference to the story found in Luke 16: 19-30.

Bill writes, "It's the story about a rich man – who isn't named – has nice clothes and all the food he wants, while Lazarus lies at the man's doorstep and dreams of eating the crumbs that fall from the rich man's table." (I leave it up to each of you now to read the rest of that Scripture story to find out what happened to both the rich man and Lazarus). Writer Bill goes on to say, "I need Lent. I need the Church to take me by the shoulders and give me a little shake and say, 'Listen, there is a value in going without. There is a grace that comes with fasting. There is a need to make sacrifices.' Going without? Fasting? Making sacrifices? Isn't that sort of, well, pre-Vatican II? And as a post-Vatican II father, don't I want to make sure my kids get the message that it's much better to do something positive during these 40 days rather than?" Bill continues, "That's a lovely trap. So comfortable. One of my favorites. We don't need to do something as silly as giving up candy because We can maintain our regular, heavy TV schedule because We only need to follow the letter of Church law when it comes to meatless Fridays during Lent and fasting between meals on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday because But the message the Church has always taught, the example Christ lived, is that there is a value in fasting. That saying 'no' to oneself is a positive act. The rich man in Jesus' parable is living on bread alone, and so spiritually he is starving. If I go through life with my eyes closed and mouth open, the same thing is happening to me. Doing without has to become a part of my life and a part of my family's life. It is a source of grace we all need."

Amen! I'm a firm believer that fasting does, in fact, pay spiritual dividends when practiced and offered for good and holy intentions (and we can also do some positive things too, i.e. additional prayer and Scripture reading, Stations of the Cross, etc.); and Lent provides that time of "special opportunity" to practice the little known art of saying "no" to ourselves, saying "no" to some well-established habits, dressed perhaps in the form of certain TV programs, favorite desserts, recreation, refreshments, and relaxation.

Actually, for me, many years ago (I was about 24-years old) it was after "fasting" from smoking during Lent that at the end of the six weeks I was relieved of all desire to return to the cigarette habit (Thank You, Lord). God understands how difficult it is for us to mortify (to put to death) our desires, to say "no" to them, and He honors our efforts.

May this Lenten season be one of enduring prayer and sacrifice, resulting in a deeper and enduring faith.

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
