

Dear Brother Knights,

Following is a column from 2006 that can still be helpful to us for our journey in faith:

In our on-going efforts to grow in our faith, especially during this Lenten Season, perhaps the following from an article written by Gerald Korson, editor of *Our Sunday Visitor*, in the March 12, 2006 issue of that paper can provide some guidance for forming spiritual habits in our lives. Although the article references a book written to help those with alcohol and drug abuse problems, the author writes, "It can be adapted for anyone struggling with an addiction or habit they wish to break – drugs, food, smoking, gambling, illicit sex, cursing or other behaviors. The key to the program's success is our growth in love for Christ.The steps to be observed daily, include the following:

Make a morning offering immediately upon waking. '.... Heavenly Father,l offer you during this day myself, all my works and prayers, joys and sorrows, and in particular, the worldly pleasures and delights of [state your addiction or attachment here], which I forgo, as an expression of love for your Son, Jesus Christ. I pray that these gifts may be pleasing to you, and that you will favor me with your blessing, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.'

Pray Christ-centered prayers frequently. In our hearts, 100 times daily or more, we pray the Jesus Prayer – 'Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner' – or a similar brief expression of faith and reliance on our Savior.

Ask His Mother for an increase in love. Our growth in love for God will strengthen our resolve and motivate our conversion more than anything else. '.....O Blessed Mother of God, I beg you that I may receive your Son, Jesus, into my heart, through the Holy Spirit by whom you conceived Him. Teach me to know and love Him without measure, as you adore Him as Lord and Savior. Draw me to Him so that I may imitate Him in all things and thereby obtain the blessing of our heavenly Father, through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.'

Make a habit of spiritual reading. Spend 15 minutes each day reading the Bible, lives of the saints or other good Catholic spiritual works.

Return to God often. Find moments to offer thanks, to ask forgiveness or to direct a petition to Him. Grace before meals, a mid-day Angelus and a 3 p.m. recollection of Jesus' death are positive habits to foster. We could spend 15 minutes on a daily Rosary or scatter the decades from morning to evening.

End with prayer. A brief examination and rededication to growing in love for Christ comprise an apt "nightcap," as the late Cardinal James Hickey once called it.

Live a good Christian life. We must keep up our Church obligations and be productive, law-abiding members of society according to our abilities. Despite our failings, our orientation must always be toward living the faith-filled Christian ideal."

The author continues, "I'll go out on a limb here and suggest that we all have at least one habit or vice to overcome. Whether we've 'fallen off the wagon' of our spiritual resolve for 2006 or just need a more structured prayer life, following these suggestions can show us how to get on track again."

Most likely, not everyone who reads this will need it – but some, perhaps many, will need it; I pray it will be helpful. God bless you.

Loving Father, thank you for the sources of grace all around me; help me to take greater advantage of them day by day. Amen."





MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
