Deacon's Beacon

Dear Brothers,

Following is a column from November 2001 reminding us of the importance of praying for the souls of those who have been called from this life. It is indeed a good reminder for us during this month of All Souls Day (Nov. 2) to pray daily, offering prayers, Masses, sacrifices, Communions, sufferings, and good works for them. This column briefly describes how they will return the favor:

Who of us wouldn't like or don't like to have others praying for us? I am one of those who will take all the prayers I can get. I just finished reading a small booklet entitled Read Me or Rue It (by the way, "Rue" means "regret") by Father Paul O'Sullivan, O.P. (E.D.M.) published by Tan Books. It's one of those brief type of booklets, light on number of pages (only 48), but heavy on "food" for thought and reflection. It's one of those books or booklets I know I must read again in order to better digest what it recommends; to allow the contents to sink, not only into my head but also to sink deep into the sanctuary of my heart.

Basically, the booklet encourages us to pray for the Holy Souls. This from the Foreword:

"The book tells us how to save ourselves and how to save others from untold suffering. Some books are good and may be read with profit. Others are better and should be read without fail. There are, however, books of such sterling worth by reason of the counsels they suggest, the conviction they carry with them, the urge to action they give us that it would be sheer folly not to read them. Read Me or Rue It belongs to this class. It is for your best interest, Dear Friend, to read it and re-read it, to ponder well and deeply on its contents. You will never regret it; rather, great and poignant will be your regret if you fail to study its few but pregnant pages."

I'll share more in next Sunday's Bulletin about the contents of this powerful and inspirational booklet, but until then let us begin or continue in all seriousness to pray for the souls of those departed, the Holy Souls, both those who have been known to us and even those unknown to us.

The following are brief quotes from the booklet: God "desires most earnestly to have them in Heaven. He places in our hands the means of assisting them, He gives us the power to relieve and even release them. Nothing pleases Him more than for us to help them. He is as grateful to us as if we had helped Himself.

...... They will never cease these prayers until they see their benefactors safely in Heaven."

Talk about return on investment! Let's be sure to include the Holy Souls in our prayer routine.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, Lamb of God, have mercy on the Holy Souls.



THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
