

Those of us who planted tomato plants in the Spring are now enjoying the "fruits" of our efforts, in spite of the mosquitoes waiting to pounce when we attempt to do some picking. For many, the gardening routine is one that's been enjoyed over a number of years and provides memories of various weather patterns, results of different varieties planted, and of course, discovering the ones we enjoy the most.


Reflecting on past gardening seasons reminds me of one some years ago in which I had a good crop of tomatoes, but unfortunately they were failing to ripen; they were remaining green. Without realizing it when the tomato plants were planted in the Spring, what had been a small tree growing near the garden had now, through the years, grown into a much larger tree, and of course provided a great amount of shade over the tomatoes during most of the day, thus preventing them from becoming ripe; they remained green and without much sunlight were not becoming all I had hoped for when they were planted.

Perhaps this story can serve as a reminder to us of what can happen, or not happen, if we fail to allow the "light" of Christ into our lives in sufficient amount, thus preventing us from "growing" into all God created us to be; preventing us from becoming "ripe" in the Lord.

Hopefully, this analogy will remind us of the importance in having some **quiet**, **daily** prayer time (the "sunlight") with our Lord, talking to Him, reading and reflecting on His Word, allowing the Holy Spirit to encourage, refresh and inspire us, to give us direction; it truly is essential for our spiritual growth. Membership News



Membership Recruitment Drive

When the Knights of Columbus wants to maximize our recruiting efforts we need to call for a weekend Parish Membership Recruitment Drive!

Here are the 5 Phases to conducting a Parish Membership Recruitment Drive

Phase 1: The Preparation Phase

Obtain the pastor's permission to conduct a Membership Drive at the church during a specific weekend(s) and to get the event advertised in the bulletin. This is also a great time to get the priest onboard as a membership recruitment assistant. The next portion of this phase is to order recruitment materials from the Supreme Council Supply Department (Allow 4 - 5 weeks for delivery). Next, begin lining up members to assist with the Membership Drive. Be sure to inform the insurance representatives about the dates of the recruitment drive; remember they are professional salesmen and your greatest assets.

Phase 2: The Execution Phase

Before each Mass at the chosen parish, set up information tables at every door of the Church. Have plenty of prospect cards and pens on hand to distribute to each man as they enter the Church. With the pastor's permission, arrange for a membership recruitment announcement to be made during Mass by either the priest or the council's grand knight. After Mass, have brother Knights on hand to answer any questions and to collect prospect referral cards as men leave with their families.

Phase 3: The Follow-Up Phase

Within 48 HOURS, personal contact must be made with every prospect that you collected during the second phase. Be sure to inform these prospects that you will be holding an informational seminar and give them the date, location and time. Offer transportation if that is a limitation and be sure to invite the prospect's family so that they can see the benefits that they receive as a family member of a Knight of Columbus.

<u>Phase 4: The Orientation Phase</u> This phase begins with organization. Nobody is going to want to join the Order if your informational session seems unplanned or disorganized. Be sure to have plenty of recruitment brochures about the Order and your council on hand for prospects and their families to read. Request that your council's Chaplain start the event with a prayer and some words about the Order and its mission. Consider showing one of the DVDs available from the Supreme Council Supply Department (A nominal shipping and handling fee is charged).

A member of the council should make the requirements for membership known to those assembled and then offer each prospect a Form #100 to fill out before the event's conclusion. Have brother Knights on hand to assist prospects in completing these forms. Conclude the event with some light refreshments and inform the candidates of the date of the next First Degree.

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
