Dear Brother Knights,

Following is a column provided for our Church Bulletin in September 2010; I believe you would agree the advice continues to be relevant today:

Hardly a day goes by that we don't hear about or even encounter examples of disrespect, anger or mean-spirit and often it can be difficult for us to accept or respond in a manner pleasing to our Lord· I recently found the following in my files, printed from the Internet (SpiritDaily·com) in January 2009, that may be helpful when faced with particular challenging situations:

Law of the Garbage Truck

One day I hopped in a taxi and we took off for the airport. We were driving in the right lane when suddenly a car came out of a parking space right in front of us. My taxi driver slammed on his brakes, skidded, and missed the other car by just inches. The driver of the other car whipped his head around and started yellingat us. My taxi driver just smiled and waved at the quy; and I mean, he was really friendly. So I asked, "Why did you just do that? This guy almost ruined your car and sent us to the hospital!" This is when my taxi driver taught me what I now call, 'The Law of the Garbage Truck!' He explained that many people are like garbage trucks. They run around full of "garbage," full of frustration, full of anger, and full of disappointment. As their "garbage" piles up, they need a place to dump it and sometimes they'll dump it on you. Don't take it personally. Just smile, wave, wish them well, and move on Don't take their "garbage" and spread it to other people at work, at home, or on the streets. The bottom line is that successful people do not let "garbage" trucks take over their day. Life's too short to wake up in the morning with regrets, so Love the people who treat you right, pray for the ones who don't. Life is ten percent what you make it and ninety percent how you take it. Have a blessed, "garbage"-free day!

Our first response after reading this might be, "Easier said than done!" And, Yes, I agree, but let's remember how very necessary it is to be guided by the Holy Spirit, to ask for the help of God's Grace (always available, for the asking) to overcome our natural, human tendency. Membership News



Membership Recruitment

When the Knights of Columbus wants to maximize our recruiting efforts we need to call for a weekend Parish Membership Recruitment Drive!

Here are the 5 Phases to conducting a Parish Membership Recruitment Drive

Phase 1: The Preparation Phase

Obtain the pastor's permission to conduct a Membership Drive at the church during a specific weekend(s) and to get the event advertised in the bulletin. This is also a great time to get the priest onboard as a membership recruitment assistant. The next portion of this phase is to order recruitment materials from the Supreme Council Supply Department (Allow 4 - 5 weeks for delivery). Next, begin lining up members to assist with the Membership Drive. Be sure to inform the insurance representatives about the dates of the recruitment drive; remember they are professional salesmen and your greatest assets.

Phase 2: The Execution Phase

Before each Mass at the chosen parish, set up information tables at every door of the Church. Have plenty of prospect cards and pens on hand to distribute to each man as they enter the Church. With the pastor's permission, arrange for a membership recruitment announcement to be made during Mass by either the priest or the council's grand knight. After Mass, have brother Knights on hand to answer any questions and to collect prospect referral cards as men leave with their families.

Phase 3: The Follow-Up Phase

Within 48 HOURS, personal contact must be made with every prospect that you collected during the second phase. Be sure to inform these prospects that you will be holding an informational seminar and give them the date, location and time. Offer transportation if that is a limitation and be sure to invite the prospect's family so that they can see the benefits that they receive as a family member of a Knight of Columbus.

<u>Phase 4: The Orientation Phase</u>
This phase begins with organization. Nobody is going to want to join the Order if your informational session seems unplanned or disorganized. Be sure to have plenty of recruitment brochures about the Order and your council on hand for prospects and their families to read. Request that your council's Chaplain start the event with a prayer and some words about the Order and its mission. Consider showing one of the DVDs available from the Supreme Council Supply Department (A nominal shipping and handling fee is charged).

A member of the council should make the requirements for membership known to those assembled and then offer each prospect a Form #100 to fill out before the event's conclusion. Have brother Knights on hand to assist prospects in completing these forms. Conclude the event with some light refreshments and inform the candidates of the date of the next First Degree.



THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
