Dear Brother Knights,

Following is a column from a 2005 Church Bulletin and, of course, still relevant:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." These are the words we hear in today's Gospel reading from John 3:16 and it's probably one of the most often quoted of any readings from Holy Scripture. It's short, it's only one verse, but I there's a great amount in its message. Let's take some time to read it again, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal to us what it is He wants us to understand more deeply from it, what it is He wants to have indelibly stamped on our hearts and in our minds.

Perhaps for some of us it will be mostly about God's incredible love for us while for others it may be about what Jesus did for us. For many, it may be about the believing part; and then asking ourselves how much we really believe in Him. We might begin by asking the Holy Spirit to help us recognize those situations and/or circumstances in our lives that provide the evidence of what we do, or don't do, to grow in our personal relationship with the Lord. Most times it's hard to believe and trust completely in someone we don't know very well.

This reminds me of the story of the high-wire walker who was walking on a wire stretched across Niagara Falls and everyone watching cheered for him; then he pushed a wheelbarrow full of bricks across and everyone cheered even louder. He then asked the crowd if they thought he could wheel a person across in the wheelbarrow and they all responded all the louder, they believed he could. Then he asked for a volunteer.

Does it surprise us that no one volunteered? If we had been there, would we have volunteered? Jesus asks us to believe in Him, to trust Him, to know Him, not only know about $\text{Him} \cdot \text{He}$ invites us to spend time with Him that we might know Him in a personal way.

There may come a time in our lives when we must face getting into a "high-wire wheelbarrow" and entrusting all to our Lord· May our belief in Him be all it needs to be when facing that decision·




A Tool for Success & Supreme Convention



MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
