# Deacon's Beacon

Following is the column written for the Sunday Bulletin for July 29-30, 2006; it's words continue to be relevant as this month of September revives memories of the works of evil we experienced in 2001:

Surely the condition of the world doesn't have to be the way it is. Surely God doesn't approve of the terrorism, the violence, the hatreds, and so much more that must grieve Him terribly. Just as parents are saddened if there is division among their children, so our heavenly Father is saddened by the many forms of division that result in much suffering for so many. All this in spite of Jesus' Words to his followers (and we would like to include ourselves in that group) in the Gospel of John 14: 27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." There should be no doubt that Jesus wants us to live in peace with each other, and yet the influence of the "enemy," Satan, upon our human and fallen natures, establishes road blocks to our finding the peace that only our Lord can provide. And again we might ask, "Why must this be?"

Let's reflect on these words, spoken for the Israelites from Psalm 95, realizing they still apply, to all of us: "Do not grow stubborn, as your fathers did in the wilderness, when at Meriba and Massah they challenged me and provoked me, although they had seen all of my works. Forty years I endured that generation. I said, 'They are a people whose hearts go astray and they do not know my ways.' So I swore in my anger, 'They shall not enter into my rest.'

Are these words not so very appropriate for our current time? Have we not challenged and provoked God by our sinfulness, even though He has blessed us abundantly? And yet God always provides direction for us to turn to Him to find the peace He offers. May we be encouraged by His words to the Israelites, and to us, found in 2 Chronicles 7: 14: ".....and if my people, upon whom my name has been pronounced, humble themselves and pray, and seek my presence and turn from their evil ways, I will hear them from heaven and pardon their sins and revive their land." Jesus also provides us direction through the Gospel of John 14: 6, where He tells us, "I am the Way, and the Truth and the Life ......" It should be easy, shouldn't it? And yet it seems to be so difficult.

May we turn to Jesus, with sincere and humble hearts, to pray for the conversion of sinners and for the peace that can be found only in Him. God bless you.

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, then I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me." Rev. 3: 20

Also, let's remember to pray for the souls of all those who died on 9/11/01, and those whose lives have been touched through the loss of loved ones who died that day.

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
