Deacon's Beacon

Brother Knights,

Following is a column written for our Church Bulletin the last weekend in August, 2001, and one written for the following weekend, in September; my hope is they will provide some "food" to reflect upon:

"No sooner said than done," "We are called to 'walk' the talk." Those quotes took on new meaning for me in the past few days. In this column last weekend, one of the "little things" listed as a way to grow in our relationship with the Lord was: "Bear patiently what we cannot avoid. Suffering, if accepted with calmness and for God's sake, loses its sting." Little did I think when I wrote that segment of the column, it would so quickly be applied to me. As a matter of fact as quickly as last Saturday morning, when I detected the beginning of another experience of a kidney stone.

As I write this two days after Saturday, the stone is being stubborn and challenging me to "practice what I preach," by "bearing patiently what I cannot avoid." Be sure that one of the first things I did was to "offer it up" for some good and holy purpose; that, along with some medication, has made the pain just slightly bearable; it has lost a little of its sting. Someone once said, "This too, shall pass." I'm praying, and asking for your prayers, that also applies to kidney stones; and the sooner the better.

Thanks be to God, "This too, shall pass", also applies to kidney stones. Although it took longer than I would have prescribed, the stone did pass on Wednesday night, about 10:30 PM, a mere twelve and a half hours before the scheduled "surgery" to remove it. To be sure, my faith, my trusting in the Lord was tested, but once again His mercy, love and compassion were evident and experienced. The statement, "God is seldom early but never late" was tried and proven, once again to be true. This was the first time I had ever seen a kidney stone and although I suppose they vary in size, this one was about one half or perhaps only one third the size of a BB. That's pretty small in my way of seeing it, but "oh!" the turmoil it caused, much like "tiny" sins, I suppose, that even though they are what might be considered "small" sins, are still capable of causing pain and turmoil, with remaining after -effects.

Is there a lesson in this for me and in turn for you via my sharing this story with you? I believe God wants to teach us something thru each of our experiences, if we take time to reflect on the experience and listen for the teaching of the Holy Spirit. The comparison of the tiny stone and the turmoil it causes being compared to tiny sins and the devastation they can create may be one of the lessons; another lesson may be a reminder of the need for humility (a reminder of our dependence on God) and strong faith; to trust God, come what may; to draw closer to God because of the experience; to pray for relief and healing and at the same time to accept, with the help of God's grace, offering them up, giving our sufferings purpose (it's OK, God; may Thy will be done; it's call "Redemptive suffering"), using difficult situations as opportunities for Grace.

Let us all try to remember to be looking and listening for whatever it is the Holy Spirit wants to teach us thru our experiences; let's always be open to Him in order to continue to grow in our faith. And thank you for your prayers, they have been powerful before the throne of God.





THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
