Dear Brother Knights,

The following is from a column written in September, 2006; may it provide some "grace:"

I would like to think each of us has a "special" prayer resource we use on a regular, if not daily, basis. This resource might be in the form of a prayer card, a Scripture commentary, a booklet of meditations, a booklet of various prayers, novenas, etc. One of my favorites is a small book of meditations with the title, *MyDaily Bread*, published by Confraternity of the Precious Blood, and each meditation is constructed with three parts; in the first part of the meditation, Jesus speaks to us, while in the second we think about what was said, and in the final segment we pray about what was said. Following are excerpts from one of the meditations (Chapter 104, beginning on page 205) entitled, *The Gift of Grace*:

Christ:

My child, when I give you actual graces, your mind receives holy thoughts, your will has good desires, and you feel drawn toward Me. Such graces are special gifts of Mine. They help you to rise above earthly attractions and worldly satisfactions. Never oppose My actual graces, but follow them and use them faithfully. You will then prove your loyalty to Me, and you will merit still greater graces. By prayer, sacraments, self-denial, and self-conquest your spiritual life will grow. Little by little a marvelous change will come over your thinking, your desires, and your actions. You will be living a holier life, a life more like Mine.

Think:

The grace of God! Next to God Himself, this is my most precious possession! With His actual graces God speaks to me, draws me on toward my true, eternal greatness,

Pray:

My loving Creator and Father, I am unable to do anything worthy of Heaven unless Your grace enlightens, strengthens, and assists me in my thoughts, desires, words and actions. Only with your help can I do what You desire of me. Without Your grace I am helpless against the slightest temptations. May I never neglect the actual graces which You send me throughout the day. With You I wish to walk safely each hour of the day toward Heaven's eternal happiness. Amen.

May each of us have some daily quiet time with our Lord in order to experience the grace He has for us. God bless you.

MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND?

During the three days of the Cursillo weekend from Thursday evening to Sunday evening, people from all walks of life grow close to one another. Religious and lay people form a living, working Christian community to gain a deep awareness of the treasures and responsibility of their faith. The goal of the Cursillo weekend is to give those who make it a new understanding of Jesus Christ, the basic Christian truths, and the desire to serve the church.

The Cursillo weekend is a blend of seriousness, light heartedness, spiritual exercises, talks and discussions. The teachings of Christ are discussed within an atmosphere of joy and song. There are meditations and talks by priests and laymen, and everyone making the Cursillo weekend is urged to participate by taking notes, discussing, and even by making drawings that illustrate major points.

The Cursillo weekend ends at the close of the three days. However, the whole point of the Cursillo movement is that ordinary people can steadily grow in the love and service of God and man for the rest of their lives. Christian growth is not easy, but the Cursillo weekend provides a framework for it, both during the three days and afterwards. In the Post-Cursillo, emphasis is on maintaining a vibrant and growing Christian community, thus springs the apostolic action required to make ours a better world to live in.

For many, a Cursillo weekend is a new awakening to a deeper friendship with Christ.
