On June 6, 2009, St. Barnabas Council # 8603 presented Herman "Bud" Cooper an award recognizing him for his 20 years as the chairman of the Council's "John J. Gallagher Scholarship Award". Much of Bud's life has centered on the education field. After high school in Paterson, New Jersey, Bud attended college out of state, and then entered the Marine Corps. Bud became a commissioned officer and while at Camp Lejuene, North Carolina, Bud joined the Knights of Columbus. He went through his First, Second, and Third Degrees in one day. After 8 years in the Marine Corps, Bud attended Farleigh Dickinson University in Rutherford, NJ and graduated with a teaching degree. He taught for 2 years at Saddle Brook in Bergen County. Bud then moved to Ocean County and decided on Bayville, where he joined the staff of Central Regional High School (Bayville, NJ) as a science teacher. Bud taught for 33 years at Central Regional. While at Central, Bud received a National Science Foundation Grant, which allowed him to gain a Master's Degree over four summers. In 1984, Bud joined Council 8603 where he became a Grand Knight. As a member of the 4th Degree Assembly #1926, Bud became a Faithful Navigator. As a member of the Marine Corps League, Bud was the Lacey Detachment Commandant and he was the New Jersey State Commandant. Bud also became the Vice-Commandant of the Northeast, which encompassed all of the detachments in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. Bud spent 16 years as the Chief Naturalist at Island Beach State Park and led tours for groups of college students for environmental study. Bud, who is married, is the father of two children and stepfather to six girls. For the years of service to his country, his dedication to education, and his contribution to our Brotherhood, Bud deserves a resounding "Thank you."
