#### **Pro-Life** Notes

Our time on the sidewalk in view of the Planned Parenthood office became very interesting on my last day of marching for life during this session of 40 Days for Life. We had two unexpected visitors, God and Satan. Let me explain. On the one hand, there was Francine, who pulled up to our small group of 4 Pro-Lifers who were starting the 10AM shift. While remaining behind the wheel of her auto she thanked us for what we were doing but lamented that enough is not being done when a woman keeps her baby. Here is her story! Her rape happened 17 years ago. Her attacker was convicted and sentenced and is having a parole hearing this April. She is less concerned for herself in so much as she has a restraining order against him for herself, but because her daughter is a minor, this safe guard is not available to her. Restraining orders cost \$300 each year, and even if her daughter would be eligible for one, that would be \$600 each year, a steep price for a single mom who is working 70 hours a week just to make ends meet. She asked if there was anything we could do to help this situation because her attacker has been sending her daughter birthday cards and she expects trouble when he gets out. During the shift, we prayed for a mom who had seen the conception of her daughter as a life made in the image of God, a valuable human being, even if it was through a violent act. We prayed for the safety of her daughter, and for a change of heart of the mom's attacker. Just before the end of our shift, we became aware of two young ladies who, no doubt, were sponsored by Planned Parenthood. They were dancing at the far end of the sidewalk while holding signs promoting Planned Partenthood and abortion. They were quite athletic as they bounced around on the sidewalk in their tight tights and form fitting tops. They drew a lot of attention from passers-by on Oneida Street. Suppose they had to gyrate a ton to stay warm, as the temp was around 40 degrees and each had an exposed midriff to garner more attention. My group made two final passes through their display before the next group took over, mainly to show we were not intimidated by their misbehaving. Don't these young women realize they were once fetuses. They don't need compensation from Planned Parenthood, they need counseling. Unable to find words for counseling, I will pray for them for a conversion of heart..
