Successful Lenten Fish Frys Net \$25K for Council 2269!



We would like to express our thanks to members of the council and ladies auxiliary for all their help at the dinners. Whether you were purchasing dinners, serving, or packaging to-go dinners, you

were always there to help. We were also successful due to the continued support and assistance from Assumption Grade School's students and parents week after week. St. Dominic high school students came out to help in a big way.

Preliminary numbers for the seven fish fry dinners are this: 3,741 meals served for total revenue of \$53,681. After expenses and sales tax, our council netted \$25,172!
