I had a couple of their weddings, one done almost completely in their tradition, including offering Mass in Spanish although I don't know Spanish. (I did have help!) I have a friend that's black. He's a wonderful fellow, friendly, smiling, hard worker, successful in his pursuits, everything you would like in a friend. It hurts me to hear how he and his family are treated by his neighbors and others - insults, even to the children, putting dog dirt in his mail box, refusing to take money out of his hands because they are black, stopped unnecessarily by the police, and so forth. It's hard to accept when you hear of a professor or some other successful person being ill treated, rejected by others. You may have been very upset at the George Floyd event and others taking place. You wonder what kind of people, Christians there are in our communities. Before you judge others, take a look at yourself. Do you fully accept the Native American, the Hispanics, the Hmong, other immigrants and refugees? A friend admits that when she sees a group of black people together, she gets nervous and is concerned about her safety. She knows that that is being racist. Are you free of racism. Are you working at your attitude? Are you accepting every individual as Jesus does?
