Proposed Standing Resolutions

Proposed Standing Resolution Option A.

Resolution for the establishment of a Council "Facilities Management Fund" and

Whereas, Council standing resolution No. 001 states:

"All monies received on account of initiation fees and twenty-five percent (25%) of all monies received from payment of dues, plus any other funds deemed appropriate by the Council (regardless of source) shall be deposited in a special fund to be known as the "Building Fund" of this Council, and such fund, together with the interest thereon, shall be maintained for the purpose of providing and maintaining a permanent home for the Council";

And

Whereas, after 19 years of operation, the Council has accumulated approximately \$87,000 in the Building Fund;

And

Whereas, an analysis of past and projected Council Cash flow indicates that the Building Fund will not reach sufficient size to realize a permanent home for the Council in any reasonable time frame;

And

Whereas no plan or planning process exists for the disposition of the Building Fund and no individual or committee within the Council is specifically charged with stewardship of, or planning for the disposition of the building fund.

Therefore Be It Resolved:

That the Knights of Columbus Council #10947 Building Fund originally established through the Bylaws process and re-established via Council #10947 Standing Resolution 001, shall be replaced in total by provisions of

this proposed Standing Resolution. The following conditions apply to the operation of this fund itself and authorized uses for its proceeds:

- 1. The funds formerly referred to as the "Building Fund," will now be named and titled the "Facilities Management Fund."
- 2. No permanent fixed financial contributions to the fund are established or required. Financial contribution requirements, if any, are to be established each year as a part of the Council's annual budget formulation process.
- 3. The Council #10947 "Facilities Management Fund" is authorized for the procurement of a facility or facilities for Council use. The facility may be rented, leased, or purchased space. If the council allows other St. Andrew's Church organizations to use the procured facility (space), a nominal fee may be charged for its use. If the lease/rented agreement so allows, the facility may be sub-leased or rented to other organizations (e.g. another Knights of Columbus Council). The council insurance policy shall cover the Council's use of rented/leased space. Other organizations shall have their own appropriate insurance coverage when using the facility.
- 4. The Council #10947 "Facilities Management Fund" is also authorized to be used for the procurement of facility-related equipment (e.g. food preparation and storage, furniture, storage facilities, etc.).
- 5. Funds from the Council #10947 "Facilities Management Fund" are authorized for use for facility additions, renovations, repairs and major maintenance.
- 6. As consistent with the Bylaws and/or Standing Resolutions, "Facilities Management Fund" expenditures, outside the Council's budget process (i.e. budgeted items), shall be presented to the Trustees for consideration and recommendation, and will be voted on and approved by the Council.
- 7. Monies within the Council #10947 "Facilities Management Fund" shall only be invested in instruments with no risk to principal (e.g. CD's, other financial instruments, and accounts issued

by banks with FDIC insurance backing; United States Government issued Notes and Bonds; and/or financial instruments issued by the Knights of Columbus).

8. The "Facilities Management Fund" may also be used for the construction or renovation of a Parishowned room or addition when construction is planned to expand the parish church and/or school. This room or addition may have closets for council property.

Proposed Standing Resolution Option B.

Resolution for the Dissolution of the Council Building Fund and $\,$

Whereas, Council standing resolution No. 001 states:

"All monies received from payment of initiation fees and twenty-five percent (25%) of all monies received on account of dues, plus any other funds deemed appropriate by the Council (regardless of source) shall be deposited in a special fund to be known as the "Building Fund" of this Council, and such fund, together with the interest thereon, shall be maintained for the purpose of providing and maintaining a permanent home for the Council;"

And

Whereas, after 19 years of operation, the Council has accumulated approximately \$87,000 in the Building Fund;

And

Whereas, an analysis of past and projected Council Cash flow indicates that the

Building Fund will not reach sufficient size to realize a permanent home for the Council in any reasonable time frame;

And

Whereas no plan or planning process exists for the disposition of the Building Fund and no individual or committee within the Council is specifically charged with stewardship of, or planning for the disposition of the building fund.

Therefore Be It Resolved:

- 1.All contributions into the Building Fund shall cease immediately.
- 2. The Grand Knight shall appoint a committee charged with the development of a plan for presentation to the Council for the dissolution of the Building Fund. As a minimum requirement, the plan shall require observance of the rules and restrictions that currently apply to normal Council expenditures, and investments. The Committee shall also ensure that all recommended funds transfers include identification of tax impacts.
