Grand Knights Letter

Brothers,

They say March roars in like a Lion and it certainly has this year. However, despite a relentless winter (holy smokes it was snowing on March 30th for crying out loud!) our Knights keep warming the hearts of the Church and Community. On March 29th we had one of our bigger fundraisers, the Art Auction. This year we partnered with the St. Clare Council. This was a tremendous partnership and we worked extremely well together sharing the division of labor and effort. We had hoped that with selling 160 tickets we would have had a better turnout but the weather was a big deterrent. In spite of the rain we sold nearly \$12,000 worth of art. Preliminary results indicate that we will earn around \$2,400 in commissions. Coupled with the ticket sales and advertisements we will realize gross proceeds of about \$3600. We are currently finalizing the expenses to determine the profit from this major event. I would like to thank Brothers Jim Feeney (co-chair) and Rob Morson (food & beverage) along with Brother Mark Roddy (St. Clare Council lead) for all their work and efforts that went into the planning of this big event and all the Brother Knights from both Councils that worked the Art Auction. Also huge thanks to all the wonderful Knights and their wives and the parishioners of St. Andrew's who bought the art supplied by Marlin Arts. Personally I was holding out for an Elvis on velvet but I guess they are in short supply.

By the way, Bonnie Skokan gets the award for the most exuberant art buyer and Jim Feeney gets the award for buying the largest piece of art. They were both beautiful pieces of art. Congratulations to the purchasers of these fine pieces of art.

We are happy to announce that we will have our bi-annual Compton Road Clean-Up on Saturday, April 5th. CANONIZATION OF POPE JOHN XXIII AND POPE JOHN PAUL II

The 1st event will begin on Saturday April 25th beginning at 7:30pm at the Blessed John Paul II Shrine with a series of events running continuously through 6:00pm Sunday, April 27th. These events include Praying the Rosary, films relating to Blessed John Paul II, simulcast of the Canonization, Divine Mercy Sunday Mass, Ceremony renaming of the Shrine, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of the Relics of St. John Paul II, etc. For information regarding the events and times that will take place throughout these 22 ½ hours, please read the attached flyer. Please try to attend part of all of the events being held at the John Paul II Shrine.

The 2nd event will be held on Sunday May 11th. There will be a National Mass of Thanksgiving for the Canonization of Saint John

XXIII & John Paul II at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception beginning at Noon. The principal Celebrant and Homilist will be His Eminence Donald Cardinal Wuerl and our Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori will concelebrate. Following the Mass there will be a procession to the Saint John Paul II Shrine which is short distance down the street from the Basilica where the day's event will conclude with the veneration of a First-Class Relic of Saint John Paul II.

Virginia Knights, Ladies and their families are asked to attend these very special and important events. There is also a need for a sizable Honor Guard. As the canonization of John Paul II approaches, I am writing to invite you and your brother Knights in Virginia to participate in two related celebrations in our nation's capital.

First, a series of events is planned for the April 26-27 **Canonization Weekend** at what will soon be known as the "Saint John Paul II National Shrine" located at 3900 Harewood Road NE. A full schedule of events is enclosed, but in particular, I hope that many Knights will be able to attend the activities on Sunday, April 27, starting with the 9:30 a.m. Renaming Ceremony and 10 a.m. Mass of Thanksgiving on Divine Mercy Sunday. For more information about Canonization Weekend, please visit: jp2shrine.org.

Second, there will be a **National Mass of Thanksgiving** for the Canonization of Saint John Paul II and Saint John XXIII at Noon on Sunday, May 11, at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, located at 1400 Michigan Avenue NE. His Eminence Donald Cardinal Wuerl will be the principal celebrant and homilist, and our Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William E. Lori, will concelebrate. Following Mass, there will be a procession from the Basilica to the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, where the day's events will conclude with veneration of a first-class relic of Saint John Paul II.

I hope that you will be able to attend one or both of these celebrations, and I ask that you promote both among your state officers and membership. Please prioritize the May 11 events among Fourth Degree Knights, given the need for a sizable honor guard for the procession — Sir Knights can sign-up for the honor guard at jp2shrine.org/may11. Chaplains and other priests are welcome to concelebrate either Mass and should to RSVP to brandon.brown@jp2shrine.org or 202-635-5417 only if they plan to concelebrate.

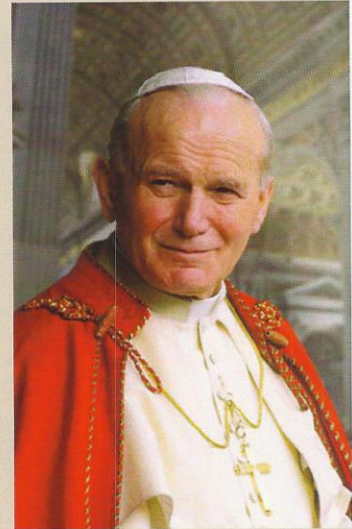
