# FISH FRY 2015 Status

Another fish fry year is complete and it was a record year. A large **Thank you** to all of the Knight and their family members that volunteered throughout the fish fry season without your hard work and participation our fish frys could not be successful.

We set new records for attendance this year, we had one night with over 1150 meals served and two nights over the 1000 mark. We also set a new average nightly attendance of just over 900 meals , compared to 821 last year. We only had one night below 800, and that was the night that Omaha was hosting the NCAA tournament. We continue to grow in popularity and we had several fish fry teams visit us throughout the season, along with a few that came back on the last night as they rated ours as the best in the first five weeks.

Over the next few weeks we will start finalizing the bills and be able to determine the actual profits of the fish fry. If you have any outstanding fish fry bills please get them submitted as soon as possible to Glen

The feedback from our customers this year was very positive, and I will share a few of these below along with a note from Father Dan. I heard several people comment that our fish tasted better than ever, and we had no CO problems in the fry tent thanks to the new ductwork. The placemats were also a huge hit and profit center.
