

From our principles of Charity, Unity and Fraternity, we foster programs in Church, **Community**, Council, Culture of Life, Family and Youth.

Communities have unique needs. Knights of Columbus Councils, including us at Rosensteel, find ways in the community to help those in need a mission its members embrace, our first principle called **charity**.

Rosensteel Community programs include:

#### • Coats for Kids

With many families with young children struggling in tough economic times, there was a clear need to provide warm winter coats to children in their communities, so the Coats for Kids program was born. It's been called a real "Win-Win-Win" program. Some beneficiaries close to our home include using the Montgomery County Police giving out costs where needed. PGK Dan Ward told me, "A gift of a coat today by a Police Officer will be remembered for a long time into adulthood."

### • Food for Families

The Knights of Columbus is committed to ending hunger in local communities by asking local councils to participate in the Orderwide Food for Families Program by donating food to local food pantries, community food banks and soup kitchens.

Here at Rosensteel we participate in two Catholic Charities Programs. The Cup of Joe program is our Council's most successful Food for Families Program. The Council works with Catholic Charities to assemble over 4,000 sandwich-size bags of breakfast food items for a number of shelters.

### • Tootsie Roll Program

The Knights are involved in supporting organizations that provide support and services to those who are intellectually and physically challenged. Here at Rosensteel we have partnered with other Councils by pooling our fund raising efforts and together donating funds to those organizations such as St. Joseph's House and St. John's House. You may have put pocket change in many of the yellow and red containers located throughout the Council building. Maybe you took some time on a Saturday to standing in front of a supermarket or high school football game handing out Tootsie Rolls.

Please find some time to offer your time, talent and/or treasure to one of these charitable community events.
