

All Knights are also welcome to attend and renew their degrees. I will be soliciting a few volunteers when the date is closer, and we will be having attendees RSVP also.

We hope to see you at the next blood drive on June 3, 2018.




New Pancake Breakfast April 29th Jack Woitas

Another successful fish fry season has passed, the fryers have been cleaned, the tent taken down and everything is back in storage for another year. This was our most successful year ever. On March 2nd, we new single night attendance record with 1328 meals served. We set a new record for overall attendance with 6405 meals served over the 6 weeks, an increase of approximately 600 more meals than in 2017. And for the first time in our history, we averaged over 1000 meals a night for the season. We had great feedback from our patrons, on the quality of our food, the inclusion of local craft beers, and the great hospitality of our staff. These accomplishments could not have occurred without all the help from each of you and your families.

Our overall gross revenue including placemat sales is over \$81,000. We are still waiting for final costs to be compiled and paid so that we can determine our net profits. We should have the final figures in the next month.

I often get asked how much actual food did we serve over the 6 weeks, so I have included a small table here that shows some of our figures:

As we start planning for next year, we will be putting together a committee to explore replacing our aging fryers. We will be looking for a solution that can work in our outdoor fry tent, and will allow us to fry the fish and fries faster while maintaining our quality. This year the exhaust system in the fry tent was once again upgraded, we would like to thank Prairie Mechanical systems for donating their time and material. I would just like to thank all of our volunteers one more time for all of the hard work this year at the fish frys, without you they would not be a success. I know the nights can get long, however, seeing the smiling faces of our patrons enjoying the fish fry makes it worth all the work.


