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From the Desk of SK Deacon Dan....



Transformation is a critical skill of a life centered on Christ Jesus, who has risen from the dead. Using the seasonal metaphor, "We are moving from the cold dark winter months into the fresh new life of spring," is mundane compared to the journey of faith. The multitude of new Catholic Christians assuming the fullness of ecclesial community is amazing. And we do not leave them without direction.

According to St. Paul these neophytes are referred to as children. Mystagogy is part of the continuum of transformation; it is the 50-day Eastertide following the celebration of Christian initiation at the Easter Vigil. The newly baptized persons received sacramental catechesis in the RCIA programs at our parishes. They now participate fully with our communities in the Eucharistic life and in the missions of our parishes for justice and peace. Catholic Christian formation brings our brothers and sisters into the full life of the Christian community and assists the newly baptized persons until their anniversary of initiation.

This period reminds everyone that growth in faith is ongoing and lifelong. Each of us is challenged to find meaning during the forty days of the Lenten Season, and our experience of Holy Week and Easter provides an opportunity for transformation. Each Catholic Christian has the opportunity to grow and transition in their faith. There is no better place to engage this reality than the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The Catholic liturgy provides the grace and inspiration for movement in our faith life. The components of worship propel us by deepening our relationship with the One who died for our sins. We gather as a people and ask forgiveness in the Penitential Rite. The words of Sacred Scripture inform not only our minds, but also our hearts where God has written His love. Divine love is expressed in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass where we are reminded, "This is my body, a sign of the new and everlasting covenant. This is my blood, poured out for you that sins may be forgiven." Our hearts are opened as we are drawn into Christ and He in us. What we see, hear, and touch is interpreted differently because our senses are oriented to the love of Christ Jesus recognized in all peoples. Justice and peace will prevail in our approach to those on the periphery (Pope Francis).

The opportunity of the Easter resurrection and transformation is prevalent during every Holy Mass. The intersection of God's love, demonstrated in Jesus, His only begotten Son, and our offering of self produces an impenetrable truth of faith. The grace given by God which surrounds us, the nourishment in the sacraments, and our community bond become the armor of salvation. Transformation occurs in the very essence of our being, but it is authentically manifested in our relationships with others daily.


